WRPDB's Ranching Projects At Upper Ogun

The countryside around the Upper Ogun area is very different from most of the Western Region, since it consists not of forest, but of Savannah land. Such land is very suitable indeed for farming and for grazing, and at the beginning the Board decided that we should try on a small scale and, as an experiment, mechanized farming and also ranching

The pilot scheme for mechanized farming was not successful and we therefore decided to concentrate most of our efforts towards the establishment of a very fine cattle ranch. There were many important difficulties to be overcome, but we knew that if we could achieve our aim, we would be

helping to show that good cattle could be raised in our Region and so begin to make possible a larger and better supply of first-class meat for the people.

Apart from this important aim, we also wanted to make use of land which, unlike many of our projects, is far away

from big towns.

We had started our pioneer work in 1952, but in 1954, we made extensive plans to go ahead in a big way.

At the beginning of January 1955, there were one hundred and ten cattle on the estate but it was planned to purchase more breeding stock bringing up the total to 350 heads consisting of N'dama and Keteku. These cattle are the most suitable breeds, the N'dama on account of its superior meat and the Keteku for size.

Thirty N'dama heifers and two bulls were purchased in Sierra Leone, arriving on the Estate in June, 1955, and a second batch of the same breed consisting of sixty heifers and four bulls were imported from the Belgian Congo arriving in August.

You can get some idea of why we imported the cattle by looking at the picture on this page which shows the N'dama and Keteku cattle—fat and healthy—and also the usual cow found in Northern Nigeria which contains very little meat and is not very healthy.

 Registration of Children for Primary One in January, 1957.

It is notified for general information that the registration period previously announced to be from Monday, 7th May, to Friday, 3rd August, will be broken by a short period from Saturday, May 19th, to Monday, May 28th, inclusive to allow for the conduct of the regional elections.

2. Except in the case of Delta Province and in certain area in Benin and Ondo Provinces, it will not yet be possible to issue Admission Forms to registered children as, owing to Prior claims on the Government Printers, insufficient numbers are as yet available. For the time being, the children's name on the Admission Register will be sufficient guarantee for entry into school in January 1957. Children will be required to collect their Admission Forms at a later date.

The Government of the Western Region of Nigeria has already expressed its approval of the policy adopted by the Western Region Production Development Board of establishing plantations in every Division of the Region in co-operation and often in partnership with the Native Authorities. Where the result is a partnership, it is usual for the Native Authority to supply the land the value of which is assessed and treated as their contribution to the scheme. The Board then supplies the necessary funds and technical direction, and the value of this represents the Board's share of the capital.

2. When a plantation so established comes into bearing, the proceeds of the crops are used first to repay to each partner the amount of money he has put in by way of capital and thereafter, the Native Authority and the Board shares the annual profit 50/50. For example, if a Native Authority were to supply 1,000 acres of land suitable for oil palms, they might expect eventually to get an annual profit over £13,000 at present world prices.

3. Alternatively, the Board also undertakes schemes where it leases on a long-term basis land from Native Authorities at economic rent. In this case, where the Native Authority receives the rent each year, even during the establishment period, the Board retains the whole of the profits but the Native Authority benefits not only by the annual rent but also by the increased development and activity which always follows when the Board undertakes new plantation or other work in the District.

4. If, therefore, you have any suitable land which may interest the Board, you are invited to send particulars to this office so that the necessary investigations can be made. Upon the receipt of your application, the land will be fully investigated and the area visited by the Board's expert staff who will be able to say whether the land is suitable for development and what form of development should be undertaken.

Board In Partnership With The People

In accordance with the policy laid down by the Western Region Government, as set out in the "Development of the Western Region of Nigeria 1955-60," the Board is expanding its schemes whereby it comes into partnership with local communities to establish plantations and the necessary proceedings. The two crops specifically mentioned are palms and rubber.

The Board's arrangements with regard to these partnerships are flexible as can be seen by the following examples:-

(a) Urhongbe:

The Native Authority has rented to the Board 4,000 acres at £400 per annum and has asked the Board for an advance payment of five years in order that they can build for themselves a water supply. This request is receiving the sympathetic consideration of the Board.

(b) Araromi:

A similar approach has been made to the Board whereby an advance of rent will be used by the local community to build and tar a road. Such an application has been received and is being considered by the Board.

The following partnerships have already been entered into by the Board whereby the local community supplies the land and takes a share of the profits:-

Apart from the direct benefit of rent from the Board, the Board often, as part of this contribution, improves the area by construction of road to plantations, etc. Also, the local people take the opportunity of establishing markets and there is an improvement in the prosperity of the area generally.

Grading Of Rubber For Export

1. Under the Rubber (Inspection for Export) Regulations, 1951, exporter of Rubber are required to have their rubber graded according to prescribed grades, by the Government Produce Inspection Service. The Cameroons Development Corporation, Pamol Ltd. (U.A.C.), J.A. Thomas Estates, Joseph Asaburo Estates, and the Western Region Production Development Board Rubber Factory, have been exempted from this requirement.

2. There has been some criticism that Nigerian rubber would have a better chance on world markets if it were graded according to the more widely recognised R.M.A./R.S.S. standards, rather than according to the grades prescribed in the Regulations. It has also been suggested that grading by Government Inspectors is not entirely satisfactory, particularly because it delays the rapid movement of rubber.

3. The Produce Inspection Board, after full consideration, has decided that there is considerable force in this criticism, and proposes to take steps to amend the Regulations by adding further exporters, who it considers to be capable of doing their own grading, to the Schedule of persons exempted from the Regulations. Such persons will then be able to grade according to the R.M.A./R.S.S. standards, or other recognised marks.

4. If this extension is successful, and helps Nigerian rubber to obtain a better price on the world's markets, it is hoped that it will be possible eventually to revoke the Rubber (Inspection for Export) Regulations entirely.

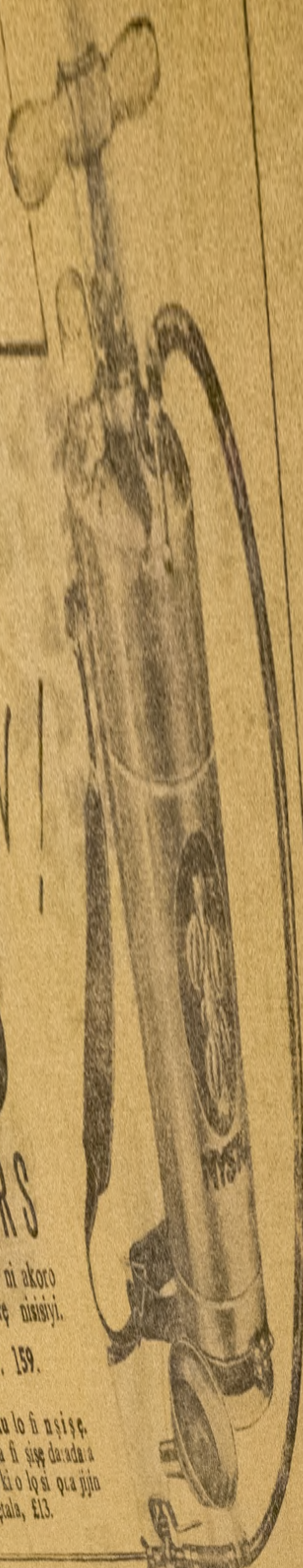
5. Exporters wishing to gain exemption from the Regulations should apply in writing, using the official forms which may be obtained from the Secretary of the Produce Inspection Advisory Committee of the Region in which their place of business is situated.
