To Save Food: Inflatable Warehouse For Tropical Countries

LONDON—A new method of storing tropical crops has been developed by British scientists which should help to reduce the tremendous losses suffered from insect damage to stored food, particularly in tropical countries.

The new method, developed over the past two years by Britain's Tropical Stored Products Centre in collaboration with commercial organisations, is an airtight, portable, inflatable warehouse.

One will shortly be proving its worth in Africa, where it has been bought by Kenya's Maize Marketing Board to store bagged grain.

The first such warehouse to be built was demonstrated in Britain last week. It is an oval 66ft in diameter and 22 feet high and holds 500 tons of grain.

Made from nylon covered with polyvinylchloride (P.V.C.), the lack of oxygen in it kills the insects and the growth of fungi is prevented.

It is claimed that the new method saves the cost of fumigating stored grain and obviates the use of insecticides with their risk to human health.

The plastic covering is resistant to rodents and can be protected against termites.

Low-Rental Rooms For Students Going To Britain

LONDON—Thirty students from overseas are now living in lowrental private rooms at a hostel specially constructed for them in Bristol (west England).

The hostel, Meridian House, was opened last weekend by Martin McLaren, Member of Parliament for north-west Bristol.

The idea of Meridian House was born in 1963 when two Bristol University students decided to do something which would

ensure that overseas students had a warm welcome in Bristol.

They appealed for funds and one year later the Bristol Diocesan Board of Finance decided to assist. Later they were helped by the British Government scheme for overseas students' welfare expansion and also by the British Council.

Meridian House cost £40,000 to build.

Helicopter Takes Buck Safety

KENYA—Sixty rare hunter antelopes, threatened with total extinction, are being flown by British Royal Navy helicopters to the safety of a game reserve in Kenya. The helicopters are from the aircraft carrier, ARK ROYAL.

The Navy was called in by the Kenya Game Department to help save the antelopes. There are believed to be only one thousand left, and they are nearly all concentrated in a small area on the Tana River. To ensure that they do not become completely extinct, a breeding herd of them is being transferred to the 8,000 square mile National Park at Tsavo, 160 miles from Nairobi.

Nigerian Leads British Youth

Club

LIVERPOOL—A new £10,000 headquarters for the multi-racial Stanley House Youth Club whose youth leader is a Nigerian was opened in Liverpool recently.

Twenty-nine-year-old Anthony Akomah, the youth leader, is a social science graduate from Asa, and Lagos. The Club, formed a year ago, has one hundred members aged fourteen to twenty-one, three quarters of them the sons and daughters of Nigerians, Ghanaians, Liberians, Rhodesians, West Indians, Somalis and Indian immigrants to the city.

"Our club is different from others in Britain in that we set out to cater for the needs of members of the overseas community in Liverpool," Mr. Akomah told our correspondent. "But it is a multi-racial youth club and more members are English," he added. "One of our principal aims is to provide a centre where the youth of the area can find good recreational facilities and at the same time have an opportunity of learning a craft which would help them when they become adults," Mr. Akomah explained.

Lagos UPP Mem- bers Support Waddell

According to the news reaching our office Officers and committee Members of the United People's Party in Lagos have issued a statement disassociating themselves from the report which appeared in the Daily Times this week about the alleged removal of Mr. Waddell as Chairman of the Party in Lagos.

Members hereby affirmed their support and implicit confidence in Mr. Waddell. No complaint has been brought by any section of the Party in Lagos and maintained against him the report thus published was unauthorised.
