THE NIGERIA POLICE

VACANCIES FOR CADET SUB-INSPECTORS OF POLICE

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for direct entry into the Nigeria Police Force as Cadet Sub-Inspectors of Police. Applicants must have a genuine desire for a career in the Police Force, and should satisfy the conditions laid down in the Police Regulations in respect of—

- Age: Not below 19 years or above 25 years
 - Height: Not less than 5 feet 6 inches
 - Chest Measurement: Expanded chest measurement must not be less than 34 inches
 - Physical Fitness: Candidates must not suffer from any type of physical deformities and they will be required to pass the Government Medical examination for Physical Fitness.
- Scale of salary—Scale H. 9 £318—£5—348
£363—£8—396

QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must possess General Certificate of Education with passes at Ordinary Level in at least four subjects which must include English Language, and Mathematics or a West African School Certificate with Credits in at least four subjects including English Language and Mathematics. These are minimum requirements and Candidates with Advanced Level passes in General Certificate of Education, or University Graduates, will be considered. Candidates taking their West African School Certificate examination in 1962 may apply but their final selection will depend upon the result of the examination.

TRAINING: Selected applicants will be attested into the Force as Cadet Sub-Inspectors on probation, and will be required to undergo, in the first instance, basic and advanced training courses for twelve months at the Southern Police College, Ikeja. The training course, which will include a Man O' War Bay Course, are strenuous and exacting. Cadets-in-training are expected to demonstrate a very high standard of physical fitness and mental alertness. There are excellent facilities at the Southern Police College for games, athletics and other forms of healthy recreation.

Candidates, who, during their training courses, have made satisfactory progress and passed the prescribed examinations will be posted for duty as Cadet Sub-Inspectors and attached to Police formations at the discretion of the Inspector-General for further training in practical police duties. On completion of three years' service from the date of enlistment, Cadet Sub-Inspectors who have proved their ability will be confirmed in the rank of Sub-Inspector at salary Scale H. 9 commencing at £318 per annum. If, within the probationary period, i. e. within three years from the date of enlistment, a Cadet Sub-Inspector-in-training is found unsuitable for his post in the Force, his appointment will be terminated under General Order 02204.

PROMOTION: As Cadet Sub-Inspector, they will be eligible for promotion within the Inspectorate rank of the Force. Opportunities will also exist for promotion to the rank of Assistant Superintendent of Police. Such promotion, however, will be on merit alone and will depend solely on a Candidate showing whether or not he will be suitable for consideration for appointment as a Superior Police Officer.

ACCELERATED ADVANCEMENT: Cadet Sub-Inspectors-in-training who, during the twelve months training course, have shown themselves to be outstanding and to possess all the qualities required of Superior

Police Officer, particularly qualities of Leadership, higher command, initiative, etc., will be exempted from the training courses, not be posted for duty as Cadet Sub-Inspectors but will be appointed as Acting Assistant Superintendent of Police on a salary of £690 and remain at the College for a further period of four months advanced training. Officers who complete this training satisfactorily, will be posted to duty as Acting Assistant Superintendents of Police in such posts and for such periods as the Inspector-General of Police may consider necessary. Subject to the satisfactory performance of these duties, Acting Assistant Superintendents of Police will, in due course, become eligible for promotion to the rank of Assistant Superintendents of Police on trial, on salary scale B. 1, 2, 3, & 4, £690 per annum.

Officers who, after a period of Acting Appointment are found not suitable for confirmation in the rank of Assistant Superintendent of Police on trial, would revert to the rank of Cadet Sub-Inspector.

ACCOMMODATION AND SPECIAL PRIVILEGES: Cadet Sub-Inspectors are entitled to free quarters (or an allowance in lieu), free uniform and leave privileges as enjoyed by the Inspectorate of the Force, which include 30 days' leave per annum; and free transport facilities to and from the normal place of residence.

METHOD OF APPLICATION: Application forms on which further instructions are printed may be obtained at all Provincial and Regional Police Offices.

Holland

Nigeria's economic relations with Holland are very fair. As a matter of fact, the total figures of this Country's trade with Holland have fluctuated between £20,000,000 and £30,000,000. These totals as revealed by Dutch trade records.

About half of our present export to Holland consist of oil seeds like palm kernels, palm oil and groundnuts. The country is well known with the processing of oil-seeds and vegetable oils into margarine, soap and other edible oils.

The Dutch aircraft industry is now working hard on an order for five planes, each 50 passenger seats each for the Nigerian Airways. The country

motor industry exports lorries and buses to Nigeria.

Japan

About forty exhibitors, representing Japanese manufacturers, are displaying all kinds of goods ranging from textiles to motor vehicles. The principal exhibits are fishing net machines, fishing nets, canned foods, tape recorder, transistor and television sets, electrical appliances, bicycles, motor cycles, plastic products, agricultural implements and China wares.

The JAPAN EXTERNAL Trade Organisation called JETRO, a government sponsored trade promotion agency is, on behalf of many Japanese manufacturers, participating in the FAIR.
