FACTS AND FIGURES

MUNICIPAL MEASURES' FATALITY.

A great Peril.

That a law should be passed making it an offence to sit on any of the elevated pavements of some of the large drains in Lagos or Port Harcourt be engaged to keep people off sitting on them is within legitimate ways and methods of an installation, such as the municipality, that purports to stand for the welfare of the people, that that institution ceases to act in keeping with the fundamental principles upon which it is founded, the moment it adopts measures which are apt to be detrimental or do grievous bodily harm—to the very people for whose welfare it is founded when such measures could be easily avoided.

In the first place it would be well to remember that in tropical climates, unlike Great Britain and other European countries, people take much delight and pleasure in sitting outside on pavements and other seats available in the street thereby releasing themselves of the great heat they have unavoidably suffered indoors all the day and West Africans cannot but view with great horror the monstrous appearance of the pavements in question, firmly set with long, thick and sharp-edged rails apparently to prevent people from sitting on them.

This may be wise in broad daylight; but it is in the night that it does its harm. Lagos is a place where a percentage of the population does not move about in the day and naturally in the evening people are seen strolling about evidently "taking breeze." They stroll about some quarters otherwise engaged in the daytime with traffic and such people sometimes feel tired and intend to take some rest on the nearest seats or pavements if there being no special public seats; and then !!!

There are several cases in which unfortunate individuals had been mortally or grievously wounded. For the present we shall give only three instances which happened within a very brief interval.

A few months ago a man was reported dead of wounds received from innocently sitting on one of these pavements. The incident was reported in local papers including this paper as "Elet-Ole" at the time.

One evening, two months ago, the writer was passing through Calabar Street and saw a little crowd, grazing at a violent man who was engaged in a struggle with the policemen. An order was given by a sergeant to disperse the crowd and in a rush a young man was pushed and fell heavily on these sharp rails—the wound was terrible.

The third instance is that of a young lad named Talwo Williams who by the time this paper is being read, is under the medical treatment of Dr. Okeada of Iba.

This had while playing but fallen a victim to these sharp-edged rails. A report of this incident appeared, under the caption "A. K. to be abe," in the "Elet-Ole," in the last issue but one of "Elet-Ole," as follows:—
