Once, I was invited to attend a sick schoolmaster in a Mission Yard in my town; on my arrival in the house, I asked them to kneel down with me in prayer and while kneeling, the Holy Spirit told me that there was a medicine kept inside the room. The Holy Spirit described the colour and the size of the bottle and I told them but they denied the existence of such medicine in the room. I told them they would be punished if they tell lies, after hearing this from me, one of the teachers went into the room and brought out the medicine, they were all trembling and begged me to pray the Lord to forgive them.

An old woman brought a baby boy who was sick to me, but as soon as this old woman came in, the Holy Spirit told me that the woman was a witch and she had eaten part of the head of the child. I did not pray for the child but simply rebuked and exposed the woman, I told her I would report her to the king if the child happen to die. I saw the child a week after this, he was alright.

A woman was about to give birth to a child, she was in great agony, her husband sent for me and I went there, the Holy Spirit told me to lay hands on her head and as soon as I did so, she was quiet and delivered the child safely.

The news of Prophet Babalola spread to Lagos and we invited him to come and visit us. The whole town of Lagos and Ebutemetta was moved on his arrival and he preached a wonderfully touching sermon in our Church here. The Holy Spirit told him to enlist as a member of this Organization, he did so and he received his baptism of immersion before he left for his town some months ago. Many cases of

healing were brought before him while he was here and the Lord stretched out His Hands to heal lots of people, even people from various Churches.

Since the days of the Apostles, we have never witnessed such wonderful manifestation of God's power in any country; surely the Lord has not changed His dealings with His elects, it all depends on to what extent we believe these operations of the Holy Spirit. God can still raise up many prophets &c. in His Church to-day for the edification of His Church.

Prophet Joseph Babalola said before he left Lagos that the Spirit told him that many prophets were going to be raised up among the saints in our Church and we are glad to report that another brother has just been raised up in Lagos about two months ago. Three Angels visited this Brother in the day time, they came with many messages to our Church. (1) That the Church should be more liberal to the poor saints (2) That the men and women should not indulge in putting on Gold and Silver ornaments etc. (3) That fornicators and adulterers should repent if not they would die soon.
