MACAULAY, HEELAS SAMUEL HERBERT.

Aged 59: Civil Engineer & Licensed Surveyor, F.R.S. (1892) Assoc. M. Inst. C. E. (1893), Graduate of The Royal Institute of British Architects (1893); the most consistent West African Critic of the Administration of the Colony of Nigeria; son of the late Rev. T. B. Macaulay, founder and first principal, C.M.S. Grammar School (Lagos); and Abigail Macaulay daughter of the late Bishop Crowther, n.d. West Africa's first Black Bishop of the Anglican Communion, educated Lagos C.M.S. Grammar School, and articled pupil of the Borough Water Engineer of Plymouth 1869—1873; entered a service of the colonial Government of Lagos as绘 Grants and draughtsman, 1881; appointed surveyor of Crown Lands for the colony of Lagos, 1893; respite the public service 1893; is a brilliant violinist and an accomplished musician; is a patriot endowed with a daunted courage, unrelenting will and strong convictions; a journalist of the first water; is a life-long abstainer and non-smoker; has led several delegations to Government House, notably, on the Land question in January 1912, and on February 28, 1913, to Sir Frederick Lugsden Governor-General of Nigeria; is stoutly opposed to a total prohibition of the importation of spirits into Nigeria; but a STRONG Advocate of compulsory education in Nigeria; possesses a most valuable collection of native plates china ware and photographs; is an eloquent speaker and an able and powerful writer with an extraordinary knowledge of facts; has met with great difficulties in public life; accompanied Chief Oluwa to England as a secretary relative to the Chief's Apapa land case in the Privy Council, May 16, 1920; lost his mother at Lagos whilst in England, 1921; has been given the following appropriate nick-names by a weekly newspaper published at Accra *The Gold Coast Independent* of the 9th April 1921. "An admirable Critic of Yoruba Politics"; "veritable Parnell in Yoruba affairs"; "the Napoleon of Nigerian politics"; "a veritable Cicero in debate". Publications:—Governor Egerton and the Railway, (publ. 1908); "Justitia Fiat or the Moral Obligation of the British Government to the House of Commons" (published England 1921). Returned home with Chief Obafemi, successful in the Privy Council Appeal, and was received with the Chief, an unprecedented reception by the Lagos Community, Thursday morning 25th August 1921, with the aid of a few gentlemen, successfully organized the Nigerian National Democratic Party July 1921.

SHYNGLE, EGERTON JOSEPH.

Barrister-at-Law, and planter aged 61 educated at Sierra Leone C.M.S. Grammar School, Wesleyan Boys' High School, Gambia; Foursquare Bay College (Oxford, England) called to the Bar April, 1888 came to Lagos 17th September, 1922, successfully raised subscriptions for and on behalf of Prince Eleko in connection with the Overseas Comforts Fund, 1917, for oratory and high legal attainments is second to none, is nicknamed "The Lion of the Bar" on account of his legal accomplishment as a defending counsel, is *ex plus supra*, lost his eldest son Ladipo in the war 1918, took leading part in Eleko's reinstatement, 1919; elected to the Lagos Town Council 1921; returned to the Legislative Council of Nigeria according to the new Instrument of Government relative to the Franchise granted by His Excellency The Governor Sir Hugh Clifford G.C.M.G. by the Nigerian National Democratic Party of which he is the President, September 16, 1923. JACKSON, HORATIO THOMAS.

Journalist; aged 44; born at Lagos; educated at the Sierra Leone Grammar School (C.M.S.) is a contemporary of Barrister E. J. Alex Taylor and the Honourable Eric O. Moore M.L.C. Barrister-at-Law, was a prominent native railway official during the *regime* of the famous Railway Accountant Mr. Butler Wright, up to 1903; was an agent for European firm Messrs Pearson & Co. about 1903 entered into business partnership with a Mr. Silva under the name of Silva & Samadu 1908, the business was wound up; was Commission Agent (Produce) for the firm of the Anglo-Nigerian Co., Lagos, 1908, took active part in the press and otherwise for the reinstatement of the Awajale of Ijebu Ode; toured the Northern Provinces (Nigeria) 1913—1914; took great part in the *Admiraria* play opened by Prince Eleko under the auspices of the local Government in aid of the Red Cross Fund for the late war, 1917; succeeded his father John Payne Jackson in the editorial chair of The Lagos Weekly Record 1915; founded in London a newspaper *The African Sentinel* being the London edition of *The Lagos Weekly Record*, 1920; has visited Europe on more than one occasion; caused questions to be asked in the House of Commons while in England, at one time, as regards the malayang monopoly held by a European malayang contractor at Ijebu-Ode to the detriment of the aborigines; the result was, the European was ordered by the local government to leave the country; has published musical works *The match get broken or misunderstanding: Lulu: Advance, Nigeria!* is a classical scholar, and student of *The New Psychology*, is an admirer of the Japanese mode of living; critic of the Lagard "Nigerian System" is a demon bowler in the Fields, made the Secretary N.N.D.P. 1923. BENJAMIN, BAGANDUJI JOSHUA.

Civil Engineer and Surveyor, age 46 Born at Lagos, 2nd April, 1877, son of the late John Blackall Benjamin, Editor of *The Lagos Observer* and Mrs. Hannah Matilda Benjamin.

Educated, Wesleyan Clowrogbowo Day School up to 1886, Wesleyan Boys' High School July 1886, to April 1895 and Harrogate College, Yorkshire, England, June 1895 to April 1897.

Articled pupil in Civil Engineering and Surveying to Mr. Henry E. Stilgoe, Boreah, Engineer and Surveyor to

Represented about 95 per cent of the owners of properties damaged during the operations of the Elegbata-Alakoro Reclamation at the Commission of Enquiry and succeeded in getting Government to compensate them, January to September, 1921.

Is a staunch member of local Wesleyan Church and took active part in Eleko's reinstatement 1919, is a member of the Ila Committee and together with the Hon. J. Egerton Shyngle, Messrs Herbert Macaulay and T. H. Jackson founded The Nigerian National Democratic Party of which he is an Honorary Secretary.

Married in January 1907, Miss Mable George, youngest daughter of the late Honorable Charles J. George J. P. who served the longest term, as Member of the Legislative Council in Lagos.
