OBITUARY.

We regret to chronicle the death of our esteemed and highly respected townsmen, Mr. Gabriel Hugh Savage, Barrister at Law and Advertiser, of the Supreme Court of Nigeria, and taktary of the Gold Coast Colony where he practised for many years, whose sad occurrence took place at 25, Old Oshogboho Street, Lagos, on the 21st day of December, 1945.

The late Mr. Savage has been in indifferent health for sometime and, as a matter of fact, he had been abing from Gold Coast where he was brought down by his son, Percy Savage, B.A.

Gabriel Hugh Savage was born on the 15th day of April, 1866, called to the Bar in London, December 1906, of the early age of 21. He returned to Lagos in 1891 and within a very short time earned a reputation of being a powerful criminal defender, titled Lawyer with a commanding voice. He was a Scottish Mason.

His late wife, Eiza Savage nee Benjamin, predeceased him about 10 months ago, leaving three children to survive them.

West Africa in Parliament.

The following questions and answers were raised between Lord-Commander Kenworthy and Mr. Amery, the Secretary of State, in the House of Commons on Monday are published for general information.

Nigeria (Native Executions).

Lord-Commander Kenworthy asked the Secretary of State for the Colonies, how many Natives of Nigeria were tried, sentenced to death, and executed without being allowed the assistance of counsel in the courts during the year 1944?

Mr. Amery: The number of persons executed in 1944 after trial in the provincial and Native Courts was 72.

Lord-Commander Kenworthy: I asked whether the 72 figures mentioned would state the number of persons executed without having had the assistance of counsel. That is the question on the paper.

Mr. Amery: I think there is a full answer.

Lord-Commander Kenworthy: Does that mean that some of these people had the assistance of counsel at all?

Mr. Amery: I am certain they were tried fairly.

The Pulpit and The Pew.

I see no reason, says a writer in the *Middleton Recorder*, why the Pulpit should escape criticism any more than the Press does. But sometimes it ought to be the turn of the Press. It is frequently forgetting that both preachers and editors have very diverse and sometimes queer folk amongst their hearers and readers. Neither preachers nor editors can ever give perfect satisfaction. The same person on the same article will have very different effects on different persons. Here is an illustration of this. Sir Samuel Lewis Kt. C.M.G.

The late Hon. Sir Samuel Lewis was born in Sierra Leone on 13th November, 1843 of pure African Negro parents. He left for England at the age of 23 years when he entered University College, London, where within a year of entrance, he competed for and won a prize and certificate of Hon. in the English Language even among English Students, a fact that partly accounted for the admirable and correct style in which Sir Samuel Lewis used to speak and write the English Language.

He studied law at the Middle Temple, and was qualified as a Barrister just at 28 years of age in November 1871. He returned home and began his practice in May, 1872 at the age of 28 and-a-half years. The Bar then was not so over-crowded as now but he had very able English Barristers to contend with, and this greatly assisted him. Within six months in practice in November, 1872, at the age of 29 he was appointed Acting Queen's Advocate and had a seat in the Executive and Legislative Councils of the Colony. In 1873 before he was 30 years old and within two years in practice, he was offered the appointment of Acting Chief Justice on the Gold Coast, which he was unable to accept. In the following year in April, 1874 before he was 31 he had another offer from Governor Strachan of Lagos to fill the post of Acting Queen's Advocate down there, this also he could not accept. In 1875 about the age of 32 years he was offered the permanent post of Police Magistrate in Freetown, which he declined. 1878 before he was 35 years he was appointed to a temporary seat in the Legislative Council of the Colony to which he was re-appointed in 1882 and continued a member up to his death. In the same year at the age of 39 years he was appointed Acting Chief Justice of this Colony. In 1886 whilst he was again filling the post of Legal Adviser to the Crown at the age of 43 years he was again by direct instruction from the Secretary of State for the Colonies offered the appointment of Acting Chief Justice during the administration of the late Sir Samuel Rowe, but he felt obliged not to accept the position as he thought it incompatible with his position as Acting Legal Adviser in which he had already advised certain action which must come before him for trial as Chief Justice. In June 1893 in his 50th year the

distinction of Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George conferred upon him. In August, 1895 he was elected the first Mayor of the City of Freetown. And at 52 years of age in 1896 the dignity of Knighthood of the Imperial Society of Kings Bachelors was by the Royal Command of His Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria bestowed upon him.

On 9th July, 1903, Sir Samuel Lewis was called to his rest in London, wanting four months for the completion of his 60th year, to the great loss and sorrow of the peoples of West Africa.
