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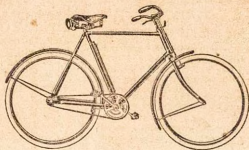

father was for many years President of the Chamber of Commerce there." Our contemporary also reported that Lady Thomson will accompany her distinguished consort to our shores.

Popular Political Phrases.

HOW AND WHEN THEY ORIGINATED.

Is Mr. Bonar Law's name to be added to the already long list of famous political phrase-makers? Will his "I don't know where I am" eventually become part and parcel of our common speech?

Our greatest phrase-makers have always been statesmen, and, not one but many a time, an occasion has become historic by the utterance of some striking word or phrase which, limpet-like, has stuck in the memory of those who first heard it, until, through the agency of the Press, it passed into the current coin of the language.

THE LANGUAGE OF POLITICS.

In his political hey-day Lord Rosebery was master of the polished phrase and sparkling epigram. His famous description of England as the "predominant partner" has seen sufficient service to warrant the belief that it is not doomed to early extinction.

In a speech made during his term of office as Premier he spoke of the House of Lords as "filling up the cup"; "ploughing the sands" is another; and it was in the famous Chesterfields speech of that period that he first spoke of "the policy of the clean slate." "His lonely furrow" was associated with the latter part of his political career.

Brilliant orator though he was, Mr. Joseph Chamberlain did not contribute greatly to the epigrammatic phraseology of the political world. On one notable occasion, however, when speaking at Manchester, he said: "We now find ourselves confronted by a people who have at last been exasperated by the continual pin-pricks which we have given them." Though he probably never for a moment dreamt of such a thing, the expression "pin-prick" there and then passed into the language of politics.

Again, at a certain memorable gathering, he gave utterance to the famous phrase: "Who now with devil should have a long spoon," but in that instance he was indebted to the author of the "Ingoldsby Legends," where it is to be found in the last line of "The Lady of St. Nicholas."

The creator of that *persona grata* of the present day, "The man in the street," is Lord Morley. Another of his few attempts at epigram was a reference to the House of Lords, when in a speech at St. James Hall in 1884, he proposed to "cut them or mend them." In this case, however, he was, wittingly, or unwittingly, simply borrowing from Sir Walter Scott's "Monastery."

HAPPY CATCHWORDS.

The orator of Mr. Gladstone fairly scintillated with happy, unforgettable phrases and catchwords.

"Advancing by leaps and bounds," "The flowing tide is with us," "The old Parliamentarian hand"—a term he applied to himself—"Back our boats behind us," "Our friends across the sea" were among his most famous utterances.

It was at Liverpool that he first used the words "masses and classes": "Upon these—equity, justice, and humanity—all the world over I will back the masses against the classes."

Some of the oft-quoted phrases attributed to the "G.O.M." are, of course, traceable to other sources. The "Unspeakable Turk," for example, is a phrase invariably linked with Mr. Gladstone's name, but it was Thomas Carlyle who first used it in a letter written in 1876. "Bag and Baggage," was used by the great Liberal leader during his speechmaking campaign against the Bulgarian atrocities.

Disraeli was one of the greatest phrase-makers that ever stepped within the Parliamentary arena. "Party is organized opinion," "Finality is not the language of politicians," "England does not do coalitions," "Reaction is the consequence of a nation waking from its illusions," "Thank you, there is the House of Lords"—these are perhaps the most striking specimens of Disraeli's phraseology.

His also are the happy phrases: "The shades of opposition," "The row of cannon, volcanoes," and "Organized hypocrisy." "Men of light and leading" we also owe to him. "Master of gibes and flouts and jeers" is applied to Lord Salisbury; and "Sublimed mediocrity," spoken of Sir Robert Peel.

From the famous orator, John Bright, we get the well-known phrase: "To join the great majority," without which no ordinary politician

would be considered complete. And it was John Bright who made use of one of the most beautiful similes in the English language: "The Angel of Death is abroad in the land; almost you may hear the beating of his wings."

Lord Brougham was an adept in the use of the apt phrases and more than one rousing political war-cry owes its origin to him. "The Bill, the whole Bill, and nothing but the Bill," was one of the great Parliamentary thunderbolts launched by him nearly ninety years ago. He is likewise responsible for "The schoolmaster is abroad," and it was he also who first spoke of "The pursuit of knowledge under difficulties."

ELECTION CRIES.

A cry, much in vogue during the "good old days"—"Register! Register! Register!" first spring from the lips of Sir Robert Peel during a stirring election contest at Tamworth. "The advice which was given by some persons," said he to the electors in an eloquent speech, "was Agitate! Agitate! Agitate!" The advice which I give you is this: "Register! Register! Register!"

Lord Derby struck out from the mental mint that happy alliteration, "meddle and muddle."

It was Dan O'Connell who first spoke the words. Nothing is politically right which is morally wrong; "Masterly inactivity" was the child of Sir James Macintosh's brain; "One man, one vote," we owe to Major Cartwright; "Three acres and a cow" is the offspring of Mr. Jesse Collings; and for the famous old Liberal motto—"Peace, Retrenchment; and Reform"—we are indebted to the Cobden Club.

Diving at random into a collection of phrases amassed during a course of somewhat desultory reading, we come upon "Backward in coming forward," for which Lord Castlereagh was responsible. "A leap in the dark" was the description given by Lord Derby of the Reform Bill. The well-worn expression: "A host in himself," is traced back to a somewhat unexpected source—namely, the Duke of Wellington, who applied it to Lord John Russell.

"Men, not measures," was a favourite dictum of the witty George Canning, whilst the oft-repeated word, "Boys will be boys," were uttered by that light-hearted statesman, Lord Palmerston.

EUROPE'S SICK "MAN."

It was the late Emperor Nicholas of Russia who first dubbed the Ottoman Empire the "Sick Man of Europe"; Sir Michael Hicks-Beach was the originator of the famous "open door" as

regards Chinese trade; while a poet and not a politician—Rudyard Kipling—has presented the Anglo-Saxon race with the "White Man's Burden."

"Home Rule" was invented by the Rev. J. A. Galbraith, and he used the words for the first time at Wicklow Street, Dublin, in 1870. The word "Conservative" was first used by John Wilson Croker in an article in the *Quarterly Review*; "Radical" was coined by Sir Francis Burdett, father of the late Baroness Burdett Coutts; the term "Jingo" made its debut in a London daily paper; the Nonconformist Conscience saw the light in a letter to the *Times* by a Wesleyan minister; and "The greatest happiness of the greatest number" was first seen in a pamphlet by Dr. Joseph Priestley—*Tit-Bits*.
