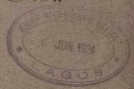

ALTHOUGH forced to accept the modern and western civilisation at the point of the Bayonette and the boom of Artillery—only thirty-two years ago—Ijebu land is among the foremost of the leading and progressive Yoruba States.

When Governor Carter directed the British Troops to fling wide open the Gates of Jebuland for Free Trade, Evangelism and Light in 1892, who could have thought that there were so many talented prodigies lying buried under the thick clouds of ancient superstition and oppression that was then prevailing in the land? To-day her sons are second to none in the knowledge of the Arts and Sciences at every seat of learning wherever they may gain admission.

The result is, that we now have amongst this tribe, eminent Divines, renowned Doctors of Medicines, brilliant Lawyers, accomplished Journalists, reputed Educationists, noted Artists, men of high intellectual attainments and they are also acknowledged keen and clever dealers in the arena of trade. Above all, Ijebu land is fortunate in having among her Leaders, Princes and Rulers, men who have reaped and are now reaping the benefits of western civilisation.

The late Mr. Joseph Odumosu, the famous Native Physician of Ijebu Ode, was a man of outstanding qualities which he utilized largely for the benefit of his country. With the scanty knowledge of reading and writing acquired under very great disadvantages, Mr. Joseph Odumosu was able to collect and preserve for the use of the Yoruba race, Recipes for Herbal Remedies as practised in the country from time immemorial. His "Iwe Egbogi" and the revised "Iwe Iwosan" are standard works on this subject and which had at the same time revealed deep knowledge of the Healing Arts possessed by our ancestors. He was the first privately owned printing plant outside Lagos. These show the extent of real patriotism latent in him.

Although it is common to see a number of amateur painters and dabblers—especially among the school children in the large towns in Nigeria, the honour of being the first distinguished West African Artist and Painter of International fame is reserved for Mr. Aina Onabolu, a native of Ijebu land, who started painting like many other amateur artists in the country, and has scientifically developed his love of Art to such an extent that he felt it his duty to relinquish his substantial post in the Government service in favour of his profession.

Mr. Onabolu's Art Exhibition at Empire Hall just before his departure for England was an eye-opener to the intelligent community. His successes whilst in England as a student of the Royal Academy is unique in the history of British West Africa. To-day we can

boast of many beautiful portraits of high government officials, church dignitaries and social leaders—skillfully painted by this Nigerian Artist.

The greatest compliment ever conferred by Government on any private individual is the honour of painting and decorating the Nigerian Stalls at the British Empire Exhibition now holding at Wembley Park, London.

As it is well known, it is not an easy matter to be an artist. Mr. Onabolu's road to fame was not strewn with roses in attaining to eminence along this un-beaten track. He had to travel through numerous disappointments and hard experience before gaining his object in life, his patriotic spirit soared high above obstacles until he secured the foremost place among the leading lights of his race and country.
