IN MEMORIAM.

JOSIAH HENRYSON DOHERTY.

Josiah Henryson Doherty is one, whose claims on us, as an African Leader, cannot be doubted, an inch; born in August 16, 1866, of poor parents, Henry Doherty the father, of Egbado tribe, and Ariwoqla the mother; young Josiah in after years was admitted as student in the C.M.S. Training Institution in this place, where he was for sometime, until a quarrel took place between him and a schoolmate, he was obliged to leave; he was recommended by a friend, then a Government Official in the Civil Service of those days; Josiah Doherty was successful in obtaining a situation, for he

was engaged by that gentleman Seidu Olowu to whom he has been previously recommended; this was in 1888. At this time, Seidu Olowu had his business establishment at a place at Massey Lane; now known to us as Vincent Street; later on, he removed his business to his present place of abode—Idunmagbo; and he on observing young Josiah's abilities and intelligence, at once placed him over those he met there, amongst whom were one Ajayi and Muse Kosoko; during this time, Josiah Doherty was staying at his parents' ground-house at Faji Market, now made a storey-house by him. He was in Seidu Olowu's employ for about 6 years, at the end of which, he started business of his own, something in 1891.

At first, he rented a piece of land out from a man named Kabiyawu at Alakoro, this place was formerly one of the real properties of the Reversible Johnson; here he commenced trading on a small scale; after some years he bought lands from the Government at 1d per foot—all being very swampy—to which he removed, and on which he built his business premises, in which he is at the present day. In 1896, Mr. Doherty stopped trading in spirituous liquors of all kinds, mainly through the influence of his mother, who was strongly imbued with the Christian spirit, which naturally convinced her, that a professing Christian ought not to be found engaged in any business that will tend to the physical and moral ruin of his fellow-men. I must not forget to say that when Mr. Doherty started his own business, it was with his own cousin the late Fred Doherty; they two were known and addressed in the merchantile world of those days as "J. & F. Doherty"; but subsequently, they were obliged to separate their joint business by mutual consent. In 1896, Josiah Doherty warmed his new building—a storey-house at Campos Square; to his house warming he invited all the school children of St. Peter's day school, besides a host of other

guests, and satisfied each and all, in respect of the good things that were provided for them. In commercial life Josiah Doherty towe's high above his contemporaries being a very successful merchant, as his business establishment at Alakoro testifies; in public life, he is popular, winning the hearts of the people, chiefly by his natural kind-heartedness and generosity; in religious life, he is an exemplary and staunch Christian, always implanting such good spirit in the tender minds of all his children; generally, Mr. Doherty is kind and liberal, has contributed largely towards the Pro-Cathedral Fund and other public institutions.

OLUSAKIN'S COLUMN.

How are the Mighty fallen.

We deeply regret to announce the death of our respected Townsman, the Merchant Prince Josiah Henryson Doherty, Esq., of "Doherty Villa", 5 Campos Square, Lagos, which occurred on Saturday afternoon, the 24th March, 1928, at 4.35 p.m.

The funeral service took place the following day the 25th instant, at Christ Church Pro-Cathedral at 3.15 p.m., before a large multitude of people.

The Right Rev. Bishop I. Oluwole, D.D., Rev. M. S. Cole, M.A., and Rev. J. O. Lucas, M.A., officiated. The Church was crowded to overflowing and every available space in the Church yard was packed to the utmost. Odunlami Street, Broad Street and the Marina were blocked by motor cars numbered over 300 intended for the funeral, and the interment took place at Ikoyi Cemetery.

The fact of his illness became known about a month ago, but the seriousness of his condition was not realized until it was rumoured that he was suffering from Ulcer in the stomach. He was attended to by many Doctors including his son.

The late Mr. Doherty was an exemplary Christian, a regular Church goer, sympathetic, kind, social generous and liberal to a fault.

Mr. Doherty's name shall always be remembered in Nigeria and its environments: he died but yet speaketh.

Mr. J. Henryson Doherty met his death without any remorse, and expressing, as we are told, to some of his children and friends that he was ready to die and not afraid of death.

He was of many wives and no less than 38 children.

To his wives, children, and to his friends Rt. Rev. Bishop A. W. Howells, Messrs. J. H. Stanley Robbin, F. Germano Martins, E. A. Motajo, F. A. Thomas, Yesufo Adebayo Ijale and the relatives of the deceased, our profound sympathy. May he rest in peace.
