### New Trial Set For Accused Slayer Of Negro Leader

Jackson, Mississippi, Feb. 10.—A new trial is planned for Byron De Beckwith, accused slayer of Negro civil rights leader Medgar Evers. A Mississippi jury, after deliberating for 11 hours, failed on Friday to agree unanimously on Beckwith's guilt or innocence. Judge Leon Hendrick then declared a mistrial and said that on March 23 he will set the date for a new trial. Meanwhile, the defendant will be kept in jail.

# Mrs. Oswald Convinced Her Husband Assassinated Kennedy

**WASHINGTON.** — Mrs. Marina Oswald is convinced that her husband assassinated President Kennedy. Her views were made known by U. S. Chief Justice Earl Warren who heads the special commission investigating the slaying of Mr. Kennedy last November 22, and before which Mrs. Oswald gave testimony.

In a televised news conference on Friday, Mrs. Oswald discussed her life with the accused assassin Lee Harvey Oswald, and expressed gratification at the way she has been treated by the commission and the press.

Justice Warren spoke on Thursday after Mrs. Oswald ended four days of appearances before the seven-member presidential commission. He said Mrs. Oswald had identified the rifle that is believed to be the assassination weapon as one that her husband had kept at their home.

She "fully cooperated" with the commission, Justice Warren said, and "filled in and elaborated on many things which she had previously described in interviews."

Justice Warren said:

"She stated that while she did not like to believe her husband killed President Kennedy, the fact presented to her since the assassination would not permit her to reach any other conclusion."

Mrs. Oswald testified that while they lived in New Orleans earlier in 1963 her husband in some activities used the fictitious name of "A. Hidell." This was the name under which the suspected assassination weapon was purchased from a Chicago mail order house.

Chief Justice Warren said Mrs. Oswald had identified about 145 exhibits gathered by federal authorities, including some of her husband's letters and memorandums and clothing.

The Chief Justice anno-

unced that the mother of Lee Oswald, Mrs. Marguerite Oswald, will testify before the commission beginning on Monday, at her own request.

She has insisted that her son was not connected with the assassination. Oswald was fatally shot by Jack Ruby, Dallas night club proprietor, two days after Mr. Kennedy's death. Ruby is awaiting his own trial in Dallas.

# British Polo Team To Tour Nigeria

**LONDON.** — A team from a leading British polo club, Cirencester Park, left London by air on February 8 for Accra where they will stay for five days before going on to start a playing tour of Nigeria.

The team will be led by the Hon George Bathurst, brother of the Earl of Bathurst. Two other members of the team, Mr RHN Worsley and Mr M Trotter play for Cirencester Park Club, and the fourth member of the team, Captain R. Head, plays for the Household Brigade Club, Windsor.

"We shall not be taking any

ponies as the Nigerians have kindly promised to mount us locally," Mr. Worsley told our correspondent before leaving.

"We are all very much looking forward to the tour and to matching our skill against what we hear are very good Nigerian players."

Mr. Worsley said that Cirencester Park had a particularly good season last summer, winning no fewer than ten tournaments, as well as a number of important trophies.

## Soviet Space- woman Meets Queen

LONDON Russia's space-woman, Mrs. Valentina Tereshkova, was received by Queen Elizabeth in London on Wednesday. Sentries of the Coldstream Guards saluted as the car carrying Mrs. Tereshkova arrived at Buckingham Palace.

The audience took place a few hours before the Soviet cosmonaut was due to receive the gold medal of the British Interplanetary Society.

The Duke of Edinburgh and the Earl of Dundee, Minister of State for Foreign Affairs, were present when the Queen received Mrs. Tereshkova with the Russian Ambassador and an interpreter.

During the 40-minute meeting the Queen and Mrs. Tereshkova talked about space and "other things of mutual interest".

# Hopes For More Nigerian Doctors

LONDON An assurance that more post-graduate students from Nigeria will soon be able to study medicine in Britain was declared "very good news indeed" by the Agent-General for Eastern Nigeria in Britain this weekend.

Mr. Akpan E. Bassey, who is touring northern and midland universities to find ways to increase the number of post-graduate places for Nigerian students, was given this forecast by the Vice-Chancellor of Manchester University, Mr. W. Mansfield Cooper.

Explaining in the past many Nigerian students wishing to study medicine had been unable to find places in British Universities, Mr. Bassey said the Vice-Chancellor had pointed out that it was a problem common to British students, as well as to those from overseas.

# On Adoption Of English Language

Is the adoption of the English language consistent with the quest for an African personality? Ali Mazrui posed this question recently in the BBC African Service programme (FOCUS ON AFRICAN). He referred to a British Council report that had suggested that English might become the official language of the world; by a curious coincidence, said Mazrui, this report had been issued when the Uganda Minister of Education had announced that the time spent in teaching English in primary schools there would be increased. "The Minister emphasised, once again, that he attached the greatest importance to the teaching of English in Uganda".

It might be asked why instead of spending more time on teaching English, African countries did not spend the same effort on developing some African language? "Well," said Mazrui, "I myself would start by conceding that what is indigenously African is in itself more in keeping with the African personality than what is imported from outside. And yet, there are other things that must be taken into account."

He pointed out that the African political philosophy of independent countries had different aspirations, of which the promotion of the African personality was only one. There were two other major aspirations - nation building, within each country, and Pan-Africanism, between different countries. Was the English language necessary for nation building? In those African countries that did not have a national language of their own, Mazrui thought that the English language could be a necessary ingredient:

### A Dilemma

However, some countries were faced with the dilemma of choosing between a tribal language and the old Imperial language, a difficult choice when a country was opposed to both tribalism and imperialism. But in the final analysis, adopting the Imperial language seemed to Mazrui the lesser of two evils. "After all, adopting the Imperial language need not bring Imperialism back. But adopting a tribal language for national purposes might arouse jealousy among other groups".

East and West Africans are now studying at the college and many more are expected following the take-over, by individual countries in Africa, of their own national communications

This is true of Tanganyika and Zanzibar, where the 5-25 effective lingua-franca I used, Tongue, had already elevated Swahili to the status of a national language. "And yet," said Mazrui, "although English is not necessary for nation building in these countries as it is elsewhere, it is certainly relevant for a high level of education and technical know-how."

Mazrui concluded his BBC broadcast by considering the Pan-African value of English. Tanganyikans might be able to talk to Zanzibaris in Swahili, but they could not speak with Nigerians in that language, or even with Ugandans. "What all this means is that while the English language is not fully consistent with the African personality, it does have a part to play in other African aspirations, especially those of national construction, African unity and technological Education."

## New Trial Set For Accused Slayer Of Negro Leader

Beckwith, a 43-year-old salesman, who is white, was charged by the State of Mississippi with the fatal shooting of Evers, Mississippi Field Secretary for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). Evers was killed 1st June 12 by a sniper who hid near his home.

The trial took place in the Hinds County Circuit Court here, a state court operating under Mississippi law. Under the U.S. Constitution law enforcement powers are reserved to the state, unless a specific federal law is violated.

The state contended the an Enfield rifle found near the scene of the slaying

was the murder weapon. A finger print found on the rifle's telescopic sight was identified by finger print experts as that of Beckwith.

On her prosecution witnesses testified they had seen Beckwith's automobile parked near the scene of the crime about 45 minutes before the murder, but none testified to having seen Beckwith actually do the shooting.

Beckwith, who voluntarily testified, admitted owning a rifle similar to the one found near scene of the murder. However, he denied killing Mr. Evers. He said his rifle had been stolen shortly before the slaying.
