












## FINANCIAL TIMES DISCUSSES PROBLEMS OF REGIONALISED MARKETING BOARDS

The Nigerian constitution contains proposals for a board to control its regional boards. The article also sets how selling difficulties arising from any new federal government structure are the subject of a four article in today's Financial Times.

The article states special attention to the form of the Marketing boards and the difficulties of maintaining a common policy should the needs pass to regional control. Says the Financial Times Correspondent: "All the four boards are extremely wealthy and the

regional governments will each have their own selling policies, which could be carried out through their own marketing boards." It is to judge from the discussion some of the present difficulties this is almost a certainty.

The article continues by saying that the boards are unique in their success as part of the colonial economic plan, their future, therefore, is a matter of considerable speculation.

## THE QUEEN APPROVES WESTERN REGIONAL LAWS

According to the latest Gazette, the Secretary of State for the Colonies has notified that Her Majesty will not exercise her power of disallowance with respect to the Western Regional Laws No. 2 of 1955.

## LIBYAN PRIME MINISTER WELCOMES TREATY

The Libyan Prime Minister warmly defended the Anglo-Libyan treaty in a speech to the Libyan Parliament at Tripoli on 4th Aug. He said: "It is not proud to say that our obligations resulting from the treaty do not affect at all our obligations as an independent Arab League and do not contradict those obligations."

After outlining the provisions of the treaty he said signature of those documents has been made after negotiations and after agreement has been reached regarding the articles of the treaty under conditions of complete equality. The signed documents do not include any obligations which will subject Libya to any administrative or financial control by any other or part of control.

It is a costly and two agreements between two free and independent countries on equal footing. Compensation between ourselves and Britain will enable one Government and Inter-Libyan Government to work for the economic stability of our country and to raise the standard of living of the people and their protection so as to enable the country to achieve economic independence at the shortest possible time.

## The London Conference.

The Conference on the Nigerian Constitution resumed in plenary session on Tuesday morning and afternoon and 10 Carlton House Terrace, under the chairmanship of the Secretary of State, Mr. Oliver Lyttelton.

The Conference continued their discussion on the structure of the central government.

The Secretary of State informed the Conference that he proposed to have a separate meeting with the representatives from the Cameroons and would inform the Conference in the light of that meeting what arrangements he considered appropriate for the Cameroons under United Kingdom Trusteeship having regard to His Majesty's Government's responsibilities for the Trust Territories.

## A A Ajibade Dies At The Age Of 54

It is with deep regret we announce the death of Mr. A. A. Ajibade the popular merchant and general Secretary of the Lagos Aborigines Society. Mr. Ajibade died at the age of 54. He was a staunch member of the Nigerian Youth Movement, Egbe Oni Oduduwa, and Area Council Lagos.
