Women's Union - Delegation Four

The Nigerian Women's Union has taken a decision not to be inactive in the race for emancipation, and has thereby resolved that the solidarity of women organisations could be achieved by personal and direct contacts.

Mrs. Fumilayo Ransome-Kuti, a member of N.C.N.C., Delegation to London in 1947, who saw the British Women at another union and how they cooperate to protect their interests and demand their rights, has agreed to lead a delegation of not less than three persons round Nigeria to assess the political consciousness of womenfolk over the country, to organise them into Unions and establish branches in various places, where they have not existed.

In attempting to do so, she expressed confidence in the women and felt that at this time, on the eve of the New Constitution, they should be given their due place in the scheme of things. She knew what Eight Women could do, in other parts of the world, why should not all others in other parts of the Country? They will first tour the West, that of the East, the North and the Cameroons will follow.

The itinerary of the Western Region is hereby published, and it is hoped all the support Nigerian women need be afforded by them.

Trade Unionist Left For America

Mr. A. A. Adio-Moses, Secretary of the Nigerian Trade Union Congress, left Nigeria from Ikeja Airport for America on Thursday June 21, 1951 where he spent four months under the United Government's Foreign Leader Program.

One of the first two Nigerian residents to receive Foreign Leader grants under the American Smith-Mundt Act, Mr. Adio-Moses is flying via Accra and Shannon and is expected to arrive at New York's International Airport early today Saturday morning, June 23.

He will proceed to the Department of State in Washington and arrange a personalised itinerary with the assistance of professionals in his field. During his tour of agricultural and industrial centres in various sections of America he will meet with labor and management leaders and exchange ideas on trade and industrial union principles and practices.
