





Coker Commission :**Awo And His Men
To Refund £85,000**

CHIEF Obafemi Awolowo, Leader of the Action Group, Chief Akintola Maja, Chief T. A. Doherty, Mr R. A. Allison, Chief Shonibare "and others" are to refund the £850,000 paid to the National Investment Properties Company by the Western Nigeria Government for the purchase of Moba Land.

The Commissioners who investigated the affairs of six Corporations in Western Nigeria ruled in their report which was published recently.

The Commission had found in the section of its report dealing with the Western Nigeria Housing Corporation, that a few days after payment, the amount was paid over to Chief Lenlehin for the Action Group.

The Commission found: (I) that this Corporation, which was established for the purpose of increasing the availability in the Western Region of dwelling houses to members of the public and of industrial estates for purpose of industry, was doing useful work;

(II) that it was wrong of the members of the Corporation to have resolved to grant loans to themselves at 5 per cent interest instead of the 6 per cent payable on building loans made to Corporation staff and the 7 per cent charged to members of the public; (III) that the Corporation's reasonable policy of "one man, one plot" had been abused by certain individuals, chiefly Mr. Alfred Rewane, who had acquired an excess of three plots, and

(IV) that the acquisition of the Moba land was highly irregular and indeed fraudulent.

ACQUISITION OF MOBA

LAND -

The commission found: (I) that the Moba land was first purchased by Dr. Maja and Chief Doherty under a conveyance dated October 10, 1958, for £11,000 from the Onitkoyi family who were the original owners of the land under customary law.

Six weeks thereafter, the land was sold under a deed of conveyance dated November 23, 1958 to Mr. R. A. Allison for £150,000 some eight months thereafter, the same land was sold to the National Investment and Properties Company Limited for over £718,000 under a conveyance dated July 4, 1959;

(II) that at the request of the Western Nigeria Housing Corporation the Regional Ministry of Lands and Housing decided to acquire the whole of Moba village land including the portions sold to the National Investment and Properties Company Limited, and instructed Messrs Gleave and Fox, who had earlier been retained for the same purpose by the National Investment and Properties Company Limited to value it;

(III) that this firm put a value of £850,000 on the National Investment and Properties Company Limited interest in Moba on certain conditions, but without seeing that those conditions were satisfied, the Regional Government paid this amount to the National Investment and Properties Company Limited.

6. All tenders, irrespective of where the firm has been obtained must be enclosed in sealed envelopes, marked "CONFIDENTIAL-TENDER FOR LORRY TRANSPORT, PORT HARCOURT" and must be submitted to the Secretary to the Authority, 216, Broad Street, Lagos, to reach him not later than 4 p.m. on 31st day of January 1963.


