Gatskell Memorial Foundation To Aid Commonwealth Students

LONDON- A national memorial to Mr. Hugh Gaitskell, former leader of the British Labour Party who died just over a year ago, will take the form of an educational foundation to provide scholarships for Commonwealth students in Britain and for British students to go the Commonwealth.

This was announced in London recently. It will be sent to prominent people everywhere.

Leaders of the churches, all three political parties, the trade unions, the academic world and two big banks have put their names to the appeal, thousands of copies of which

The appeal says: "The death of Hugh Gaitskell has deprived our country, the Commonwealth and the world of a great statesman, a man who could not ignore the challenge

of public duty.

The measure of his contribution to the solution of the economic, social and political problems of the 20th century has been universally recognised.

"His experience gained while working in the field of adult education made him a devoted advocate of greater opportunities for all, and he was a firm believer in the need to forge closer links between the peoples of all races. "We feel that a memorial to Hugh Gaitskell should be a practical contribution towards these aims.

"It is proposed to establish an educational foun-

dation for giving grants to students from the Commonwealth at British universities and colleges, both for academic and technical education.

"We also intend that the foundation should assist British students who go to Commonwealth countries to complete their training.

"The provision of such assistance will be a worthy memorial to a man whose life was dedicated to improving the lot of others.

"We confidently ask all who recognise the qualities of Hugh Gaitskell to subscribe generously to this appeal."

Cleaning St. Paul's Cathedral

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PORT-HARCOURT and ABA.

LONDON—Seven million gallons of water were used in the recent cleaning of the great West Front and two towers of St. Paul's Cathedral in London, which has been accumulating grime since Sir Christopher Wren built it 250 years ago.

Needless to say, some Londoners, affectionately attached to dark view of St. Paul's, protested that this face-wash could never have been intended. But as the director of the company in charge of the cleaning, Colonel Simpson pointed out in the BBC General Overseas Service programme 'Here and Now' it was reasonably to suppose that Sir Christopher Wren would not have chosen a white stone, like Portland, if he had meant the Cathedral to look black. In fact, there was evidence that he had himself made place to have it cleaned for a service which Queen Anne was to attend, but whether this had been done was not known.

None of those modern products advertised as washing whiter than white could be used on St. Paul's for chemicals of any kind, whether acids or alkalis, would badly affect Portland stone, which is a limestone. Pure cold water only was used, followed by rubbing down with a special type of wire brush and a form of sandstone called mason's gritstone, which breaks up and works off the dirt without damaging the stone.

Colonel Simpson commented on the remarkable good condition of the carvings even about 200 feet up on the towers, despite exposure to wind and rain. Lower down, it was fascinatingly details, he said and among some interesting pieces now clearly revealed by the removal of the accumulated dirt were the heads of three cherubs over the Dean's door, on the south side of the Cathedral. One of the three weeping and the tears are now once more visible.

English School Boys Make Implements For Bechuanaland

Three boys in the metalwork class of Rushcliffe County Technical Grammar School, Nottingham, central England were working on trowel blades as part of their plan to help Swaneng Hill School Bechuanaland.

The English school, with 430 pupils, has "adopted" the African school following advice from the British Humanist Council, and the Boys are planning on providing money, books and equipment. Already the masters and boys have sent £250 direct to Swaneng Hill and they intend sending books, wall charts and class-room apparatus.

In the metalwork class the pupils are making hoes, rakes and similar small agricultural implements.

"Know Nigeria" Campaign For British School-children

LONDON:— Twenty-four British schoolchildren were welcomed to Nigeria House, London the other day, by His Excellency Alhaji Abdul Maliki, Nigerian High Commissioner in Britain, when he launched a campaign to publicise Nigeria.

The educational campaign, "Nigeria Today," is designed to inform British boys and girls about most aspects of Nigerian life and affairs, a spokesman for the High Commissioner told our correspondent.

School parties from secondary schools in the London area will be invited to visit Nigeria House to see films and discuss Nigerian affairs during the next few months. The first school to take part in the scheme was the South East London Secondary School.

"A new theatre for film

shows has recently been completed in Nigerian House and the library attached to it contains authoritative and up-to-date films of an educational nature about Nigeria. These facilities have been brought to the attention of educational authorities," the spokesman said.

"The High Commissioner hope geography and history masters will recognise the value of this exercise as an aid in their class projects on Africa, and particularly Nigeria as an example of the emergent and stable new nations of the Commonwealth."

British Firm Designs Special Equipment For Nigerian Farmers

LONDON: A British firm is making specially designed agricultural equipment for Nigerian farmers and the first tools will be shipped in March.

Designed by Mr. A. R. Stokes, of Newton Tony, Wiltshire, who was for some time an agricultural research engineer working for the Nigerian Government, the equipment will be drawn by cattle (oxen).

It consists of multi-purpose tool frames into which numerous agricultural attachments can be fixed. The frames have

draft bars and two legs to which shares and other cultivating equipment can be easily attached for ridge farming.

When Mr. Stokes returned to Britain from Nigeria, he and his brothers started their own engineering business with the sole purpose of manufacturing farming equipment specially suitable for tropical climates.

Johnson Discusses War On Poverty With Negro Leaders

WASHINGTON, — Four prominent Negro leaders went to the White House Saturday to discuss the administration's planned all-out attack on poverty. The visitors were: Rev. Martin Luther King, head of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference; James Farmer, head of the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE); Roy Wilkins, executive Secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), and Whitney Young, executive director of the National Urban League.

After their one hour meeting with President Johnson, Dr. King told newsmen, "most of the discussion centered around ways and means to mobilize support for the war on poverty. He added there was some talk about civil rights, but it was incidental to the purpose of the conference.

Dr. King said he and the other leaders, as well as President Johnson hope the civil rights bill will reach the House of Repre-
