Manifesto Of The W. men Movement Of Nigeria

The Supreme goal of the Women's Movement is Freedom for the women of Nigeria. In pursuit of this, the following is declared:

The Women's Movement of Nigeria shall take active interest in purely educational, economic and political matters affecting the women of Nigeria principally and Nigeria as a whole and shall organize and educate the women population of Nigeria so that the women of Nigeria may accept the leadership of the Movement in all matters political, economic and educational.

The movement shall demand Universal Adult Suffrage and shall not rest until the ballot is won.

It shall educate the women of Nigeria on the importance necessary and usefulness of block voting so that when the franchise is won it will not be difficult for women nationalists to take their rightful places in the local, regional and national legislatures and it shall promote the economic interests of the country by embarking on the formation of Co-op relief, Trill & Credit and Consumer Societies.

It shall also fight for equal opportunities in the education of boys and girls at all levels by demanding (a) a definite allocation for women in the award of scholarships and (b) Co-education in Secondary schools, ONLY in towns which make provision for boys' secondary education and ignores provision for girls.

The Movement shall register an independent party in order to preserve its identity and dignity. But in future it shall form an ally with any party whose aims and objects are identical with its own.

U. A. C. Staff Will Tokunboh Returns Home After Three months Studies Lock Horns

The fourth annual Nigeria annual sports meeting of the U.A.C. Amateur Athletic Association will be held on Saturday, February 28th, on the U.A.C. sports area at Surulere. WASHINGTON—As he prepared to leave the United States after three months' study of the American labour movement, Mr. M. A. Tokunboh of Nigeria said he returned home "with valuable knowledge and experience which will, I hope, prove helpful in my contribution to development of my country."

Mr. Tokunboh, who resumed duties in the industrial relations section of the Nigerian Department of Labour's Central Office in Lagos, arrived in the United States in the latter part of October, 1952.

At once he embarked on an intensive study of the United States labour relations legislation, wage and salary administration and machinery procedure. The full facilities of the U.S. Department of Labour were available to him. Mr. Tokunboh expects to leave New York for London today, and to leave London for Lagos February 7, arriving in Nigeria the next day.
