Governor-General Of Spanish Guinea In Lagos

His Excellency the Govern-
or-General of Spanish Guinea, Don
Francisco Bazo, arrived Lagos
on Thursday March 12, 1953.

He was met at Ikeja Airport
by his Excellency Governor, Sir
John Macpherson, G.C.M.G.,
the General Officer Commanding
Nigeria District, the Chief
Justice of Nigeria, the Adminis-
trator of the Colony, the Secretary
to the Council of Ministers,
Sir Kefau Abayomi representing
the Municipality of Lagos, the
Inspector-General of Police and
the Spanish Consul where he
inspected a Guard of Honour.

On Friday, March 13th, at
9.30 a.m. His Excellency the
Governor-General visited the
House of Representatives and he
was met by the Secretary to
the Council of Ministers. Later
the same day, at 10.30 a.m., the
Governor-General, escorted by
the Administrator of the Colony,
visited the Technical Training
Institute at Yaba. In the eve-
ning of 5th October, the distin-
guished visitor had discussions
with the Minister of Labour
and the Commissioner of Lab-
our in attendance.

At 5 a.m. today Saturday,
March 14th, His Excellency the
Governor-General, accompanied
by the Administrator of the
Colony, will go to Agaje to
inspect excavations to the wharf
and the reclamation of adjacent
swamp land. He will return in
the launch, "Beryl" from Agaje
to Lagos tomorrow, Friday, at
12 noon the same day.

At 1 p.m. tomorrow, March
15th, the Governor-General
will leave Lagos Airport.
