The Rt Hon. Oliver Lyttelton Secretary Of State For The Colonies arrives At Ibadan

The Secretary of State and party landed at Ibadan on 10.15 a.m. on Monday 22nd May. They were met at the sea-gate by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, the Secretary, the Civil Secretary, and the Commissioner of Police. The party proceeded to the residence of Mr. James Ledger, where a luncheon was held with the Regional Executive Council present at the meeting, besides the official was the Oval of His, the Oba of Owo, the Oba of Ilesha, the Hon. 
