







## Doctor Manuwa Becomes D. M. S. Send-Off For A. J. Ottum

The Secretary of State has approved the appointment of Doctor A. A. Manuwa as D. M. S. (Ed.), O.R.E. M.D., C.B.S. (Ed.), F.R.C.S. (Edn.), D.T.M.B. (Edn.), L.M. (Dob.), Deputy Director of Medical Services Western Region, to be Director of Medical Services in succession to Doctor G. B. Walker, O.B.E.

Dr. Manuwa, who was educated at C.M.S., Grammar School and King's College, Lagos, and University of Edinburgh, was first appointed to the Service in Nigeria in 1927. In 1944 he was appointed Senior Specialist in 1947 Senior Specialist and in 1948 Regional Deputy Director.

Dr. Manuwa will take up his appointment as soon as possible after leaving over his duties of his present post and in any event before the next meeting of the Legislature, and will be inaugurated on the 1st of March.

A send-off party was held on Monday, Mr. Akinu Oluwalabi, who is proceeding to Kumasi for further training in Consultant life. The function took place in the 4th February, 1934.

The brother of the host Mr. E. A. Oluwalabi acted as the Master of ceremonies and Mr. A. Akinu Oluwalabi of the chair.

## French Prime Minister In USA

In Washington, the French Prime Minister, Rene Pleven, and President Truman concluded their conversation on a note of accord. Pleven expressed himself "very pleased" with the results.

The two leaders completed their conferences late on Tuesday and will issue a final communique reporting on their two days of talks.

Earlier in the day Pleven declared the French policy, in that of the United States, is to "redouble" the action of the United Nations in the struggle against aggression.

In a talk before the National Press Club he stated that nothing could weaken the alliance between the United States and France and warned the free nations of the world that they face the threat of world-wide aggression. He urged them to exercise vigilance and determination to preserve their way of life.
