# No More High Commissioner Post In South Africa

**LONDON**—The British Government has decided that the accelerated constitutional development in the three High Commission Territories in South Africa justifies the abolition of the post of High Commissioner, and the necessary instruments will be prepared as soon as possible.

This was announced in the House of Commons recently by Mr. Nigel Fisher Under Secretary of State, Colonial Office, in a written reply to Sir Roland Russell (Conservative) who asked what changes were proposed in the position of the High Commissioner. Mr. Fisher said (full text): On November 14 1961 the Prime Minister said that the question of whether the post of High Commissioner for the High Commission Territories and Ambassador to South Africa should be combined was to be kept under review.

"H.M.G. have now decided that the accelerated constitutional development in the three High Commission Territories justifies the abolition of the post of High Commissioner and the necessary instruments will be prepared as soon as possible.

In May last year, my Rt. Hon Friend announced that the Resident Commissioners of Bechuanaland Protectorate and Swaziland would be made directly responsible to him for the government of their territories. It is now proposed to make a similar arrangement in respect of the Resident Commissioner in Basutoland.

There will remain a need for consultation and in certain fields for co-operation and co-ordination between the Territories and with H.M. Ambassador. The Ambassador will therefore continue to be informed about those aspects of the Territories affairs which affect their foreign relations or their defence requirements but he will have no further responsibility for purely territorial affairs."

# EGBE OMO OLDFIN

## Salient Provisions Of Its Constitution

The Constitution of the Egbe Omo Olofin which was approved by the Council of Patrons after a joint session with the National Committee of the Egbe at Ibadan on Friday May 8, 1964, is a remarkable document in many ways. For one thing, it is a fulfilment of the pledge made by the leaders of the Egbe that it shall be and remain a purely cultural organisation. This pledge is now enshrined in the Constitution of the Egbe of which the following are the salient provisions:

### Independence Of The Egbe

"(i) It shall be a fundamental principle of the Egbe that no one holding office in a political party shall be an officer of the Egbe."

"(ii) The Egbe shall NOT support any political party in opposition to, or to the exclusion of, any other, nor shall it engage in political activities nor allow itself to be dominated or used by or be identified with any particular party."

### Membership Of The Egbe

"(a) Membership of the Egbe shall be open to all Yorubas irrespective of their religious beliefs or political affiliations."

### Patrons Of The Obas

Again, the Egbe takes a great stride in its expressed determination to return to Obas and the rulers of the Yoruba-land their lost glory. The following provisions are significant in this respect:

"(b) All the Obas of Yoruba-land shall be the Patrons of the Egbe Omo Olofin."

"(c) The Patrons shall elect from among themselves a Council of Patrons of not more than 25 members."

"(d) The Council of Patrons may, from time to time invite prominent Yoruba leaders to become life Patrons of the Egbe and the Patrons so invited may become members of the Council of Patrons."

"(e) The officers of the National Committee shall be ex-officio of the Council of Patrons."

"(f) The Council of Patrons shall select their own Chairman who shall be the President-General of the Egbe."

### Supreme Authority Of The Egbe

"(g) The Council of Patrons shall be the Supreme Authority of the Egbe Omo Olofin."

### National Committee Of The Egbe

"(h) The National Committee of the Egbe Omo Olofin shall be charged with the running of the day-to-day affairs of the Egbe at the national level. The Committee shall be responsible to the Council of Patrons and shall carry out its directions."

### Annual Conference

"(i) The Annual conference of the Egbe shall be held once a year at such time and in such place as the Council of Patrons may decide . . ."

"(j) Any resolutions passed at the annual conference of the Egbe shall have the effect of recommendations to the Council of Patrons who shall give them due consideration."

### Amendment To The Constitution Of The Egbe

"(k) The Constitution of the Egbe can be altered or amended by the Council of Patrons after a resolution to the effect has been passed by the Annual Conference. The Council of Patrons shall have power to accept, refuse, defer or amend the terms of such resolutions if they are of the opinion that it is to the best interest of the Egbe to do so."

### Aims And Objects Of The Egbe

The aims and objects of the Egbe are designed not only to promote the interests and happiness of the Yoruba people but also to ensure happy relationship between the Yorubas and other ethnic groups in Nigeria, as the following provisions will show:

"(l) To promote unity and understanding among the Yoruba people.

"(m) To maintain the authority and dignity of the Obas and Chiefs of Yoruba-land, to acknowledge their leadership and to foster complete co-operation and accord between them and their people."

"(n) To promote harmony and understanding between the Yoruba people and other ethnic groups in Nigeria."

"(o) To further the interest and happiness of Yoruba people inside and outside Nigeria."

"(p) To co-operate with the Governments of the Federation in their plans for rapid economic development of the Country particularly of the Western Region and to eradicate ignorance and superstition and to further belief in scientific and medical relief."
