

2,158 West African Students In Britain

According to an official document just published in London, there are now 2,158 West African students in the United Kingdom. Although this number includes Government scholars and private students, it is known that there are additional unregistered government students and the total exceeds 2,500.

The official list shows a total of 1,042 Government scholars from West Africa and 1,017 private students, and gives Nigeria's total as 1,324 students in Britain, the Gold Coast 253, Sierra Leone 205 and the Gambia 25.

Students at Universities and medical schools are 251 scholars.

Nigerian Girl Guides To Visit Britain

Two representatives of the Girl Guides' Association of Nigeria will visit the International Camp of the Girl Guides, Gouy-Saint-André, France, this summer. The two girls who have been selected are as follows:

According to their plans, the Nigerian Camp will probably be the first time many of the campers have ever heard a singing band.

The Nigerian delegation arrived in London yesterday evening after an overnight flight from Accra, the capital of the Gold Coast, the day before.

In a memorandum, received at 10 am this morning, from the High Commissioner for Northern Nigeria, the delegation was told to expect a tribal meeting at Kaduna on May 22. In new reports from the six tribal governments, submitted to the Nigerian government by Englishmen sent to attend the tribal meeting, no specific date was given.

"The Rev. Mr. Howells has been appointed as assistant to the Rev. J. H. Kado, the assistant bishop of the Diocese of Lagos.


