

More African Students In U.S.

NEW YORK CITY.—More in field of study among students from all parts of the world. From other countries would be soon studying in the United States than in any second United States there is in the country, and the social and economic report sources stated.

According to the Institute of International Education, more than 30,000 students is funded in several students from other countries ways. The United States pays for new arrivals in America part or all of the expenses of institutions of higher learning.

Many of the young people sent are supported by their studies in America come from own governments, and more Africa, the Near East, and South America are paying their own. There are 256 students from Iraq, 93 from India, 140 from Burma. At present Columbia University, in New York City has the largest enrollment of students from Iraq, 11 students from India, 1 from Burma, and 1 from University of California. The University of California has the next largest enrollment, and representing the most popular New York University the third.
