New London Air Terminal Opened

LONDON—The new West London Air Terminal built to deal with 6-7,000,000 passengers a year, was opened yesterday, Wednesday, by the Duke of Edinburgh.

It is anticipated that in the coming year more than 3,000,000 passengers travelling by British European Airways and the twenty-four airlines for which B.E.A. act as agents will pass through the Terminal which cost £5million.

The biggest and most modern of its kind in the world, West London terminal is ten storeys high covers an area of 4 acres, and is built on site over the London Transport's Underground junction at Gloucester Road.

Facilities provided include automatically controlled heating of ramped vehicle roadways to avoid freezing, nine passenger and two goods lifts, automatic opening and closing of doors for passenger operated by a concealed floor switch, and two conveyor systems handling 2,000 pieces of luggage an hour.

By the end of next year, as a result of neighbouring road and tunnel improvements, the joining time from terminal to airport will be reduced to thirty minutes.

Nigeria Orders 305 Truck Chassis From Britain

LONDON—Over three-hundred diesel-engined truck chassis from Britain's Leyland Motors and its Glasgow associate, Albion Motors many of them for use in agriculture and contracting work in development projects, have been ordered for Nigeria by the British West Africa Corporation Limited, Birmingham which earlier this year ordered 130 Leyland and Albion Trucks and buses.

A spokesman for the British West Africa Corporation told one of our correspondents on Wednesday, that the order was to fill general stocks. The vehicles would be shipped out to Nigeria in chassis and cab form and bodies would be assembled in Nigeria to fit special demands.

The contract signed with the Leylands Group is the largest single order received by the Group from Nigeria in recent years. Delivery of the vehicles will begin about May next year and continue into August. They will be sold through the British West Africa Corporation agencies in Apapa Enugu Kaduna, Kano, Jos, Port-Harcourt and Ibadan.

The latest contract covers 175 Leyland Combi haulage and tipper models with 125 h.p. diesel engines; 100 Albion Chieftain Super Six haulage models with 125 h.p. diesels; and 30 Albion Super three-axled haulage models with 125 h.p. diesels.

Alcoholism — An Ill-ness

(By a BBC Correspondent)

The most widespread addiction today was not drugs such as cocaine or heroin, but to alcohol, said consultant psychiatrist Dr P.H. Connell in a recent broadcast in the BBC General Overseas Service weekly programme 'Science and Industry'. The difference between a heavy drinker and an alcoholic was that the former might, for social reasons, drink a great deal at weekends, while the alcoholic had become dependent no drink, and eventually could not do without it.

Dr. Connell maintained that while no one was born an alcoholic, some people were born with certain personality potentialities, which without a specifically helpful upbringing might eventually result in a proclivity towards alcoholism. Someone basically insecure someone unable to face up to stresses who didn't mix well, might, without the artificial courage of alcohol, feel inadequate and inferior.

Previously alcohol was thought to be a stimulant; more recently it had become known to be a depressant. Today the actual area of the brain that alcohol depressed, with a resulting disintegration of judgment and the memory, had been discovered to be the Reticular Formula.

Because of many different types of personality involved, the actual treatment of an alcoholic could be difficult. But Dr. Connell maintained that an alcoholic was a person who certainly needed treatment, because he was, in fact, a sick man. With treatment, he thought that about a third of the alcoholic would recover, a third would be much improved and again roughly a third would not benefit from out-patient treatment and would need to be inpatients in an institution.

There were a number of types of medical treatment for alcoholism which depend on a patient feeling very sick if he took a drink after certain drugs had been absorbed into his blood-stream. Subsequently it would be hoped that he would associate feeling ill with drinking. After a period of abstention however, he might be tempted to think that one little drink wouldn't do him any harm. But alcoholics could not restrict themselves to one little drink.

It was specific medical treatment that social factors became extremely and increasingly important, Dr.

Connell said. After all, a person whom alcohol had helped to overcome his personality problems could not return to society without some compensation for the "Dutch courage" previously provided for him by drink. He was at this stage that organisations like Alcoholics Anonymous etc. necessary, or social clubs which would naturally help to fill in the time previously spent by the alcoholic propping up the bar.

Dr. Connell felt, though, that there was to really certain solution yet

to the problem of alcoholism. There must, he felt, be a long-term attack on it, and prevention instead of family care and child psychiatric units should play an increasingly big part in this attack. At the same time, Dr. Connell thought that so long as there were no excessive cultural sanctions against alcohol, there would always be alcoholics. The job was to cut down the numbers.



Loan For Nigerian Cotton Mill Project

LONDON — Britain's Commonwealth Development Finance Company Limited has agreed to make a secure loan of £400,000 to Norspin Limited of Nigeria for a cotton mill project in Kaduna.

The Norspin Company has been formed jointly by the United Africa Company Limited, English Sewing Cotton Company Limited and Dunlop Rubber Company Limited for operating the cotton yarn-spinning mill which will use Nigerian cotton. The mill will supply yarn to the West African Thread Company of Lagos for the manufacture of sewing-thread and knitted fabric for singlets as well as tyre cord and canvas to Dunlop Nigerian Industries tyre factory at Ikeja and will also supply other existing trade channels.

The Total cost of the project is about £1.6 million and the mill is expected to be in production during 1964.

The Commonwealth Development Finance Company Limited was formed ten years ago by many of Britain's largest industrial and commercial concerns to invest money in viable industrial project within the Commonwealth. All the money has been supplied by private investment.

A spokesman for the company told our correspondent in London yesterday, that the CDFC had invested £25 million in the Commonwealth in the last ten years. Its investments in Nigeria now totalled £2,357,000.

Britain's New High Commissioner In Ghana

LONDON — The Queen has today approved the appointment of Mr. Harold Smedley as British High Commissioner in Ghana, in succession to Sir Geoffrey de Freitas. Mr. Smedley, who is 43, is at present Head of the

News Department of the Commonwealth Relations Office. He will take up his new post in January. He has served in the British High Commissioners' Offices in New Zealand, Southern Rhodesia, India and was Private Secretary to Lord Swinton and Lord Home (now Sir Alec Douglas-Home, the Prime Minister) when they held office as Commonwealth Secretary. He was educated at Aldenham School and Pembroke College, Cambridge, is married and has four children.

Ethiopian Finance Minister's London Talks

Lij Yilma Derasa, the Ethiopian Finance Minister, who has just completed a private visit to Britain of several weeks had talks on aid with Mr. Robert Carr, Secretary for Technical Co-operation, during his stay.

The Minister, who called on a number of banks and business firms to discuss investment in his country, also had talks at the Board of Trade with Mr. E. Iku Cion, Minister of State, with the Chancellor of the Exchequer, Mr. Reginald Maudling and with the Joint Minister of State for Foreign Affairs, Mr. Peter Thomas.

Problems of Growing Populations

KAUL, LUMPUR — Problems of growing populations and the need of

developing countries for the services of their own overseas-trained professional men and women were two points emerging from technical co-operation discussions at the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association Conference here yesterday, Wednesday.

It was pointed out that qualified professional men

and women often declined to return to their own country after training overseas because they were given greater incentive to stay abroad. Consequently professionals from overseas had to be recruited at higher salaries than would normally have been paid to their own people.

Sir David entered the Royal Navy in the submarine service in 1927. After a distinguished career, he was appointed Commander-in-Chief, Far East Station in 1960, the mid-beating first Commander-in-Chief of British Forces in the Far East in 1962, holding this post until his present appointment.
