RADIOPHONE CURIOSITY.

Television, Another Possible Scientific Invention— Seeing Wimbsey From Lagos!!!

To make a telephone call upon a friend or a business man at Agege and indulge in a lively conversation in the ordinary way is wonderful enough. To receive a cable-gram sent from London, Lisbon or New York this morning is also wonderful enough. But to converse ordinarily with someone at Zaria, Freetown, Port-harcourt or any of the places mentioned above, or, still, to hear people sing in those places is the greatest miracle ever wrought by modern science.

It is Radiophone, the most wonderful development in modern days' message transmission. Considering the immensity of works this strange instrument does it should be noted for its simplicity of construction. You simply want to buy a good set and have it duly installed in your house. There is the Broadcasting Station (a sort of Exchange Office) where you can be put through and without "much ado" you may speak to or hear people speak or sing in any place on land or across the seas according to the Broadcasting Programmes—may be Jerico or Green Land's icy mountains.

In progressive countries at present Radio is the "Thing" and in all probabilities Nigeria, or rather, West Africa, may, in these days, add her own share to the daily increasing world of Listeners-in.

One is much more impressed by the change, the great change, such message transmission process is likely to make in modern civilisation and the world at large. The cause of education could be greatly furthered, for, among other ways of imparting education, lectures on academic and general intelligence could be heard from the farthest ends of the earth.

Trade relations could be much more improved by means of easy and cheap international communication.

The theatrical world will enjoy much more popularity; for, vocal concerts could be enjoyed at your own home and while you can hear the greatest, world tenor you also can dance while the world's best orchestra plays from thousands of miles away.

Radio sets could be got in portable forms and could be carried about in cars and other vehicles. "Further," says A. B. in an article published in *The World Today* for December, 1923, "all the while new usages for broadcasting are being developed. Frame aerials are being fitted to tubular cars and to touring motor cars.

Political and other oratory is being broadcasted more and more. Portable Sets with loud Speakers, capable of being heard over distances up to a mile are delighting country side gatherings and even replacing at times the bands in some of the provincial parks. The police, the hospitals and other institutions have found again and again that broadcasting organisations are of value to them.

Everywhere radio is opening new roads to the dissemination of knowledge, and to an increase of the amenities of life. Undoubtedly radio is going to be one of the biggest factors of improvement in the world as well as one of the biggest industries."

The following appeared in the *Kaiser's Telegrams* for January 22:—"Colonel Malone, the Chairman of the Radio Association, in an interview on the recent transmission of American broadcasting by a British broadcasting Company, predicted that 1924 would see television, i. e. seeing by wires, practically within the bounds of possibility." We rather should leave our readers to imagine a world in which for instance one can remain in Lagos and look at Wimbsey and see the Empire Exhibition in progress with almost as much facility as the people on the spot.
