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A PRESS UNION.

We note with pleasure, the meeting of the Editors in Lagos, a circumstance culminating in the formation of a Press Union. This is a noble attainment by our "Press," if they would adhere to the ideals in their resolution "to safeguard the interest of the local press, to raise its tone, to develop political thought and direct opinions on lines that would lead to industrial, commercial and educational progress of the country." The value of unity has no estimation and it is only feebly portrayed in the adage "United we stand, divided we fall." A practical demonstration of its potentialities is shown in the fate of the "Nigerian School Certificate Scheme," which has been possible only by the United front under one banner presented in its opposition—"As we wax hot in faction in battle we wax cold." It cannot be gainsaid that factious spirit, intolerant of and illiberal to opposite views has entered into the Lagos press, and if allowed a sway will bungle the politics of Lagos beyond a remedy. The step of the Union is one in the right direction and one which will help to sift the present hotchpotchy state of affairs and check its progress. If the movers will give out more exertion to persuade into enrolment those Editors who for the moment stand aloof, although invited, and also extend invitations to other Editors not of news-papers who but also have no less influence on

the minds of the people, and all without exception are able to rally under the same banner, then an era of halcyon days can be said to dawn on Nigerian Politics.

DEDICATION OF INDEPENDENT AFRI- CAN METHODIST CHURCH, IBADAN.

On Saturday, the 27th of July 1929 at 3 p.m. the procession of Members from the residence of the General Superintendent Bishop Thomas Henryson Scott, H.M., & F.G.P. (Honorary Minister and Free Gospel Preacher) marched with drums to the Church. Before the arrival of the members, the invitees and friends have been waiting at the Church to see the opening of the door. On the arrival of the Bishop Revd. A. B. Winfunke of Lagos and the members at the gate, the Bishop performed the usual ceremony for the opening of the door, when the key was handed to one of the prelate's daughters, Maria Boje Scott to open the door. The Organists, Choristers, and drummers went up to the gallery. The Bishop entered and blessed the pews, then a native air was announced by the Society Steward Mr. R. Ayoglu Oni to besing verse by verse, whilst the Bishop was dedicating the Chancel Pulpit, Reading Desk, Gallery and other furnitures with the exception of the lamps.

"Arise! shine, for the light is come and the glory of the Lord is risen upon us" (Isaiah 60, 1).

The Bishop mounted the pulpit in his gorgeous robe, gave an interesting sermon from Revelation 26, 11 and 12. From the sermon we were made to understand that this Church was started by him under an Aba (Tree) in the front of the Church, along with him were his three children, one male and two females. This was in the year 1923. He narrated in details to us the growth of the Church. The most pleasing part is that for the past six years not a tithing is being owed by the Church. The Dedication Service was closed about 5.30 p.m. when a group photograph was taken in front of the Church by Mr G. W. Thompson of Oke Padi, Ibadan. The invitees and friends formed procession to the prelate's residence where light refreshments were served.

On Sunday at 10.30 a.m. A General Thanksgiving Service was held, Rev. A.

B. Winfunke alias Revd. "Olowe" occupied the pulpit, gave a short and interesting sermon. At 6.30 p.m. the dedication of the lamps took place. Messrs. E. Ola Soares the Cabinet Maker of Oke Padi, Sam Orokunle and some members took part in lighting the lamps with gifts from their purses. The pulpit was occupied in that evening by a Gracious of General Booth in the person of Capt Dosumu the O-gator of the Salvation Army who gave a very interesting sermon.

On Monday, a Public Meeting was held. The Chair was occupied by D. M. Elliott Esq, supported by Mrs. Elliott, Messrs. Subern and J. King. The speakers were J. B. Iyanda Esq, S. A. Thompson Esq and Captain Dosumu, they all did their best, more especially by Mr. J. B. Iyanda the first speaker. He was on his legs for an hour, and when he took his seat the pews were less crowded. The Society Steward read the report of the Church the total expenses for the renovation was £170-3-0 and the Bishop has spent £23 6-3 out of his own pocket to build the Gallery and part of the Chancel. May the Lord bless him and crown his efforts with abundant blessing Amen.

Then followed the vote of thanks to the Chairman which was moved by the Society Steward and to the Speakers by Mrs M. J Rollings ably supported by the prelate of Church. The meeting was closed at 9.40 p.m. when an extempore prayer was offered by Revd. B. Winfunke.

When the notice of this dedication service was pasted around the town I was greatly astounded, because I visited the Church about five months before. When I got there on the day it was to be dedicated, I was surprised to see the rapid improvement. What came out from my mouth was "Praise the Lord O my soul and all that is within me praise His Holy Name, Praise the Lord O my Soul and forget not all His benefits. My prayer is that the Lord may assist the Church to build ten times bigger than this in six years to come and that He may fill the Church with His sheep who have gone astray that the Church may follow the footseps of her predecessor without fear or favour. And that the Almighty may crown all her efforts with abundant blessing and prolong the life of her Founder. My prayer also is that sooner or later branches of this Church may round

Ibadan both out and in town. Amen.

I was pleased to see Mr. Adeyinka of the Station Magistrate Office who assisted the Organist Mr. Abiola McCarthy of the Industrial and Commercial Bank Ltd., Ibadan. Mr. McCarthy displayed fingerling on his guitar when a vocal song was sung by Miss Sarah and Bimbo. Some friends from Ibadan to Ile-Ife attended the dedication.
