The new Quay wall has a frontage
1800 feet and provides 4 Berths each

The present dredged depth in front of the quay is 26 feet below low water, but the work has been designed for an ultimate doubt of 33 feet.

Four double storey sheds are provided, each 340 feet long by 70 feet wide, with sufficient floor area to store be-

The ground floor of each shed is intended for exports, and on the land side is a railway leading platform, which will permit goods to be unloaded into the shed direct from railway trucks on the sidiogs.

The first floor is intended for imports and is provided with a balcony on the lagoon side into which eargo will be slung direct from the ships, hold by means of 40 cwt Portal Granes provid-

ed on the front of the quay wall.

The first floors are also provided with 20 out wall cranes fixed in the door openings on the landward side; these cranes lower the earge into the railway trucks on the siding below and can also if necessary transfer cargo from the first floor to the ground floor through hatchways. All the cranes are electrically operated.

A telephone has been provided at the middle of each berth, the plug boxes being fixed on the face of the quay wall to provide connection with vessels lying alongside, by means of flexible cables.

The reconstructed Ebute Metta-Apapa Railway connects with the Quay, 3 sidings being laid down on the front of the sheds and 6 sidings at the back; and the main Ebute Meta-Apapa motor read is to be continued through the dock area at the back of the sheds providing access to the offices etc.
