The visit of Viscount Leverhulme to Nigeria, the visit of Her Royal Highness Princess Mary Louise to the Gold Coast.

The departure from Nigeria of His Excellency Sir Hugh and Lady Clifford after a most successful term of office. The administration of the Colony and Protectorate by F.M. Baddeley, Esq., C.M.G., the retirement of Sir H.C. Moorehouse the Lt-Governor Southern Provinces. The appointment of His Honour, Major Ruxton, C.M.G., to the vacant post. On the whole, the year 1925 brought far more evil than good to the country; its components are three odds to one even number and the harmonising influence was the Visit of His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, May God bless him !

As the year is now running to its close we are looking hopefully to the coming year 1926 and with perfect confidence in the everlasting goodness of God, we wish one and all.

HIGHWAY ROBBERS.
