SHORT STUDIES ON YORUBA WARRIORS.

BALOGUN IBIKUNLE I.

His Early Days.

Ibikunle, whose name in after years played so great a part in the making of Ibadan country in Yorubaland, was born at Ogbomoso : his mother was of Egbedo tribe. There can be little doubt that when he attained his majority he came over to Ibadan in search of adventure : this was not uncommon in those days of internecine wars in Yoruba country.

His Time of Trial.

He was not exempt from the usually known fate which generally befalls one at the outset who is marked for position of worth in after life : for we find him shabbily treated by his first wife, when on an occasion, he returned home from an expedition overcome with fatigue, and hungered : he bought some agidi balls and took some soup prepared by the wife specially for herself—mark the selfishness ! and invited his son Babayemi born to him by this selfsame woman to partake of the meal : imagine, if you please, the temper of the wife on her return home only to learn that her husband has been helping himself to her soup-pot without her authority or sanction—a thing inconceivable !!! she called her husband names and emptied the remaining soup on his head : Ibikunle, be it remembered, did not meet force with force then, but simply asked his son to leave the soup severely alone : the son, in obedience to his father, drank with him the liquid-form to which the remaining agidi-balls were reduced : the future general did not forget this incident.

Eventually our hero was ascending the success ladder gradually ; he was made the General of the Ibadan forces in succession to Oderyalo on or about 1841, as time wore, on the thought of revenging himself on his once heartless wife prevailed with him. One day he asked all his wives, 70 in number, to cook him specially

prepared *Ihasa* soup in honour of a day for the propitiation of his Guardian-spirit : each wife tried to vie with one another for the best result : in the twinkling of an eye, 70 soup-pots were in readiness ; the old wife taking particular care in cooking her own with dried bush-hog for culinary effect : all the pots were placed in a particular spot at Ibikunle's command : after this he ordered every one before him to make room as he desired to be left alone for sometime : on the spot being clear, he called Babayemi's mother and asked her whether she remembered her past treatment to him : the former replied in the affirmative : Ibikunle then began to empty the boiling soup on her bare head, and when the pain became excruciating, Babayemi involuntarily prostrated before his father and interceded for his mother, and immediately, Ibikunle desisted, saying his son's obedience to him that day has saved the mother from being scorched to death : but one thing is significant in this unhappy episode and that is, since his wife's ill-treatment as stated, Ibikunle ceased all connexion with her as heretofore, though she was allowed to remain in the house until her death.

Gospel Mission to Ibadan.

During the time Ibikunle was the Commander-in-Chief at Ibadan his country of adoption, Oyeşile was the Balé who was generally known in history as Balé Olugbode : in whose time Christianity was introduced to this country by the C.M.S. through that great and good man, the Rev. David Hinderer : the warm welcome accorded the German pioneer Missionary speaks volumes for the measure of prosperity which was noticeable, and enjoyed by the Ibadans at the time.

Wars.

The principal wars in which Ibikunle took part in his time and which were won are as follows :—

The Battle of Ara

Ibikunle's exploits were varied and numerous : he defended Ibadan against all external incursions, ably assisted by his lieutenant Ogunmola : in his time, many territorial possessions were added to Ibadan.

His Death.

On the eve of the battle of Kutuje, (1862) he was accidentally wounded by a young man whom he ordered to cut a dog into two *at a single stroke* for a sacrifice to the god Ogun : the cutlass escaped from him at a wave of the hand, and made a deep

gash in one of his thighs : the wound proved fatal and the victim was buried with military honours at Ibadan.

Thus passed away in 1864 IBIKUNLE, one of the greatest generals the Yoruba race has produced.

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
