Broom's Legal Max'm Vol. 8 p 101 former Motion was dismissed under Order 25 rule 4.

Court:—I don't decide the first Motion Order 25 rule 4 but on the principle,

Lawyer Zizer continued:—3 C.H.D. p Court of Appeal 1904 L.T. 181, p 89.

We are applying Order 53, Rule 1. Able argument by this Counsel he asked the Court: Whether the Court is going to vary or discharge he should like to know.

Court:—Your Affidavit is ineffective to Order 53 Rule 1, which you confined yourself unless you are going to make it more effective.

Zizer:—At this stage, if your honour will allow us to amend our affidavit for Friday Thursday.

Shyngle:—Your honour knows that no arguable should be put in the affidavit, I think affidavit is sufficient.

Court:—I do not suggest an amendment.

Zizer:—I think your honour should fix us this week, then we shall strengthen our affidavit.

Court:—I'll adjourn this Motion till the 1st October 1925.

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

A writer (presumably a European) in the *News and Notes* for August last, Vol. 12 No. 8 the apparently official organ of Nigerian Railway Officials, has driven us to the above versification in his attempt to poke fun at the defective education of "An African Candidate for Employment" (see page 8); by publishing in the issue under reference, what purported to be an Application for Employment from the writer's imaginary "African Candidate;" here is the letter:—

AN AFRICAN CANDIDATE FOR EMPLOYMENT.

On one or two occasions in the columns of *News and Notes* we published copies of letters indicating the ability and intelligence of African aspirants applying for situations on the Nigerian Railway. Perhaps the following application received by the Chief Mechanical Engineer is typical as regards composition and style:—

If it has been come to my *hallucination* to have come to you *confidentially* instead of my writing, but owing to my to and fro looking for work. Thereby, I had entrusted that I shall meet with good success from you and in the confident hope that you will spare no efforts in presumable to my this humble petition I had entrusted on you through the aid of heaven and by attention of gravity.

I am your most obediently servant.

Evidently the writer forgets or is oblivious to the fact that it is one of *his own countrymen* who on one occasion in the local Law Courts, when engaged in a certain matter, rather unguardedly gave vent to this quaint English, was you THERE?!!! Again, it is a European Government Official, and not an African who, in the good old days, was in the habit of equipping himself with a small-pocket dictionary whenever he was on duty in one of the public Offices in this country, to which lexicon, it is said, he oftentimes referred when in doubt of the correct spelling and the true meaning of any English word when called upon tominate his "boss"—a big colonial secretary. Pray, can any European lay claim to proficiency in writing a sensible Yoruba letter? We know not.
