Joseph Egerton Shyngle

Barister-at-Law: aged 46; educated at Sierra Leone CMS Grammar School; Wesleyan Boys' High School, Freetown; Kowah Hay College, Sierra Leone; and at Christ Church, Oxford. Called to the Bar, April, 1888, Church Council (Oxford). Called to the Bar, April, 1888, under Letters Patent, under Letters Patent, under Letters Patent. Came to Lagos 17th September, 1892, subsequently raised under Letters Patent for and on behalf of Prince Ekho in connection with the Overseas Contests Fund, 1917, for ordinary and high legal attainments has few equals; is nicknamed "The Lion of the Bar" on account of his best achievements; as a deterring counsel, is *in vogue*, took leading part in Ekho's reinstatement, 1919; elected member of the Legislative Council (Sierra) October 1923. Address: Broad Street, Lagos, Nigeria.

Ktiyoi Ajaas

Barister-at-Law: Edmund Mazaaky, aged 39; called to the Bar 14th June, 1893; arrived in Lagos, 1893; appointed Member of the Legislative Council, 1900; is a Member of the Nigerian Council, became founder and editor of the *Nigerian Pioneer*, a weekly newspaper, 1914; nominated to the Legislative Council (Sierra) 1923. Eric Olawolu Moore

Barister-at-Law: aged 47; born in Abeokuta, 1876; educated CMS Grammar School, Lagos, 1891-1894; and subsequently in the Sierra Leone Grammar School, (C.M.S.) 1895; was a student in Moulton Temple College, (Barb) England; studied Law in Middle Temple, London; called to the Bar 1902, first his father, the Prof. C. B. Moore, in Abeokuta, 1905; appointed member of the Legislative Council, Lagos, 1917; was member of the Commission of Enquiry, appointed by the Government in respect of the Ekho Unrest, 1918. Elected member of the Legislative Council (Nigeria) October, 1923. Address: "Ijumo House, Thubau Street, Lagos, Nigeria.

Eusbius James Alexander Taylor

Barister-at-Law: aged 49; educated Wesleyan Boys' High School, Lagos, and latterly at the C.M.S. Grammar School, Sierra Leone; studied Electric Telegraph in England for a time; was clerk in the Firm of Messrs. Horsfield, Herr & Co., Ltd., in Lagos, at one time. Called to the Bar, Middle Temple, 1905; impecunious; *Barrister-at-Law* in Shakespeare's *Merchant of Venice*, staged at the Glover Memorial Hall, Lagos, in aid of Dr. Sagor's Midway Scheme, 1911. Wrote a glowing reminiscence of the late Charles Forey, *Barister-at-Law*, which was published in the *Lagos Weekly Record*, 1921, in a rifted lay-out, with a commanding voice. 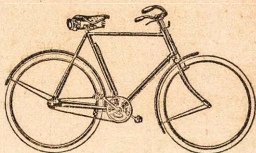

Swedenborg the Seer.

THE LIFE AND THOUGHT OF THE SWEDISH
MYSTIC.

Among the religious pilgrimages this year will be one by a number of followers of that remarkable man, Emanuel Swedenborg. They will be visiting, in June, his native country, Sweden, for the purpose of inspecting various places associated with the Seer, and especially the sarcophagus in Upsala Cathedral, wherein repose his remains which were removed from the Swedish Church in Ratcliff Highway in April, 1908.

A bishop's son.

Swedenborg, who was born in 1688, was a son of Jesper Swedberg, Bishop of Skara, an outspoken prelate, and from 1719, when it was ennobled by Queen Ulrica Eleonora, the family adopted the name of Swedenborg.

In his early days, before his Seership, Swedenborg who became Assessor of the Swedish College of Mines, showed that he was considerably in advance of the age in which he lived by inventing, among other things, a submarine and an airship, and he anticipated many later scientific discoveries. At the siege of Frederickshall, in 1718, by a system of rollers, he transported eight ships over mountains and valleys for a distance of fourteen English miles, thus enabling King Charles XII, to carry out his plans for the reduction of that almost impregnable fortress.

It was not until he attained the age of fifty-five that Swedenborg claimed to have direct and intimate intercourse with the spiritual world, and to hold converse with spirits and angels, whose sayings, surroundings, and doings are recorded in a score or more many-paged volumes. He wrote in 1769: "I have been called to a holy office by the Lord Himself, who most mercifully appeared before me, His servant, in the year 1743: when He opened my sight into the spiritual world, and enabled me to converse with spirits and angels, in which state I have continued up to the present day."

In London Street.

In confirmation of his claim several anecdotes are told of incidents tending to prove the truth of his assertions. On one occasion, long before the introduction of the telegraph and the telephone, he described in detail, when he was in Gottenburg, the progress of a conflagration in Stockholm,

about three hundred miles away. On another occasion, after having been asked to assist a woman who could not find the receipt for an account which her late husband had paid, he discovered from the departed that the document was in a secret compartment in a bureau, where it had been discovered. On a third occasion he revealed to the Queen Dowager of Sweden the fact which was spoken to her in private by her brother, the Prince Royal of Prussia, shortly before his death.

After several years of adventurous travels in various European countries Swedenborg became a familiar figure in London, where he was known of strolling about the streets, a quaint and benevolent old gentleman, in black velvet suit with ruffles at the wrist, and a sword with a curved hilt. According to the custom of the time he wore a full wig, and, being very fond of children, he used to carry sweetmeats in his pockets, which the little ones he met with in his walks.

John Wesley expressed a desire to see him, and to the conclusion of one of his preaching tours, he wrote to Swedenborg to him that it would then be too late as he (the Seer) would be in the spiritual world; in fact, he predicted the very hour of his death, on March 29, 1772.

Mystic doctrines.

Swedenborg founded no sect, but he had thousands of followers in this country and in America. In London alone there are no less than six places of worship of the "New Jerusalem Church," as it is called. Although he claimed to have personal intercourse with the spiritual world as part of the preparation for his divine mission, Swedenborg declares that spiritism is disorderly and should not be practised as it tends to destroy free-will. Compared with his descriptions of "things seen and heard," those of modern mediums pale into insignificance. He says the spiritual world is divided into three distinct parts—heaven, hell, and the intermediate state of spirits who are being prepared for their final habitation, which is determined not by mere profession of belief, but by the quality of the life lived here.

His chief doctrine is the sole divinity of the Lord Jesus Christ, whom he declares to be the Jehovah of the Old Testament. According to Swedenborg, the Last General Judgment took place in the spiritual world in the year 1757, and was followed by the Second Advent—a coming not in person but in the Word—and he affirms that the judgment of every individual takes place immediately after death. God sends no one to hell, which is a place permitted and regulated by

the divine mercy for the reception of those who were interiorly and wilfully evil, and to whom assistance in heaven would be unspeakable torment. Heaven, on the other hand, is that mode of peace where all who love God dwell in the enjoyment of an eternal life of use.

Four rules.

It may not be generally known that Swedenborg is responsible for the truism: "All religion has relation to life, and the life of religion is to do good." His "rules of life" are also noteworthy, namely:—

1. Diligently to read and meditate upon the Word of God.
2. To be content under the dispensations of Providence.
3. To observe a propriety of behaviour, and to keep the conscience pure.
4. To obey what is ordered; to attend faithfully to my office and other duties; and, in addition, to make myself useful to society in general.
