EMPIRE DAY ^Q 1925.

Empire Day falling on Sunday this year, a service was appropriately held for the children of the Empire in St. Andrew's Church (C.M.S.) at 3. p.m. of that day, which was attended by the children with their teachers from the Government and St. Paul's (C.M.S.) Schools.

Rev. T. Aderinola the Pastor, an earnest preacher, was the Conductor of the service. He took his text from Prov. 1 10: "My son, if sinners entice thee, consent

thou not." He pointed out how Solomon the wisest of all men was the writer of this book of Proverbs, and yet still, in spite of all his wisdom, he was led astray from the path of righteousness, and God took away his Kingdom from him and gave it to a servant. From this he showed how "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom."

The pastor next gave an interesting life history of Bishop Samuel Adjai Crowther in a very concise way, pointing out how his early childhood prophesied his future career. His bravery in rescuing his father's goods when their house took fire made people say that, he would be a great worshipper of gods, and that he would restore them into their land in a greater number. The result of the consultation of Adjai's parents with an *ifa* Priest was that he was to serve the great sky God. This frightened his parents, because the only worshippers of the sky God of those days were the Fulani, and these apparently were the enemies of the Yorubas—the people of Adjai's native land.

Unfortunately, war came and Adjai was captured and, was sold from hand to hand until he was sold into the hands of the Europeans who eventually gave him his liberty and education.

It was Bishop Adjai to whom the abolition of slavery by Queen Victoria was due because he stood in the presence of the Queen and told her how he had come to be in England. The Queen having pity over him, and being sympathetic with the Negroes as a race bade Adjai go, assuring him the consequent abolition of the trade in slaves.

Peace came to the Negroes, a blessing

through the influence of the Great, Good Queen and which has since and forever made her name imperishable. Another type of this character was found in Esther, a queen of King Ahasuerus, who endangered her life to emancipate her people, when they were plotted against by their enemy.

Adjai rose to be a Tutor, a Priest and finally a Bishop; and what was at first thought a misfortune was a great fortune indeed. Children who suffer at school now-a-days need not think themselves the most unfortunate creatures that lived; because crosses never come before toil, but after. The present children of Owo are reasonable to build it up with frames of pure Christianity and civilisation in future.

The service was brought to a close by the Pastor after pronouncing the Benediction. The amount of silence maintained by the children helped to make the service impressive and solemn.

It had been proposed to have Inter-School Sports on Monday the 25th May for which the District Officer had offered £3. According to the programme, the Sports were to commence as early as 7 o'clock a.m. but as luck would have it, it began to rain at a few minutes past 7 and though the rain was light, it did not cease till about 11 o'clock.

The Sports began at 12.30 noon with a Football Match between the Government and St. Paul's (C.M.S.) Schools and after 40 minutes each side, the C. M. S. won by 2 goals against nil.

With the exception of the period occupied by the Football match, the Rev. C. W. F. Jebb, the Superintendent was the m.c. for the rest of the time.

The display was well attended among the onlookers were a European, Mr. Forest of the P.W.D., Chief Sasere, the

Vice-President and the elite of the town. The dead of night crept over the Sports and so it was impossible to decide the prizes that day. That the School Children and their Teachers were feasted to their full need not be emphasised here.

The prizes were awarded on Tuesday morning, May 26th by Rev. Jebb in the Government School. The prizes were all in money and were gratefully accepted by children.

God be praised; there was no accident of any moment throughout, excepting that of a boy who received a kick of the foot-ball on his nose and caused blood to trickle out of his nostrils; this was about 5 minutes after the match commenced. The 2nd was that of the Head-master of St. Paul's School—a boy of the opposite side by accident gave him a knock of his teeth on the head and blood came out in jets. This was about 5 minutes before the end of the match. The Head-master, who is also the Scout-master suggested the First Aid remedies and at once began to play on "smiling" as a scout only knows how!

The Celebration of the Empire Day in Owo this year has been the first of its kind. The President and Vice-President respectively offered 5/- enthusiastically regretting that they were not notified in time or they would have done better.

Much praise is due the teachers of the Schools in Owo for making the celebration of the Empire Day a success.

MINNA NEWS. FROM A CORRESPONDENT.

Mrs. Johnson wife of Mr. Johnson gave birth to a male child on the 19th instant. The child was "brought outside" on the 25th instant as is the custom of the Sierra-Leonians to keep a babe indoors for seven days before showing it out. This is a prognostication of good omen for the babe. We regret to announce that unfortunately this child died on the evening of the 27th instant. This is the second loss that Mr. and Mrs. Johnson have suffered; the first was about the year 1923. Our sincerest sympathy goes to the bereaved family.

The Inspector General of Police, Northern Provinces, returned to Kaduna on the 22nd instant.

The observance of the Empire Day was made on Monday the 25th instant. At 9 a. m. all the School children with the exception of those of the Faith Tabernacle School (Faith Tabernacle courtesy) were in attendance at the African Tennis Club's play ground, just in front of the Sudan Interior Mission Church and a few yards to the market place. The School Children totaling about 80, composed of Roman Catholics 36 and C.M.S. about 44. The Acting Station Magistrate, Captain R. D. Ross and the A.D.O. I/c Provincial Office, Mr. L. H. Goble, were the only Europeans present.

The Acting Station Magistrate delivered the Empire Day Message.

Two photographs were taken but owing to shortage of photographic materials, copies will not be available for some time. Finally Mr. Heald of the Dist. Engineer's Office distributed sweets and biscuits among the School children.

On the 19th instant the Faith Tabernacle Church members invited the Sudan Interior Missionary Church members to their prayer meetings. Two of the European Missionaries attended. The S.I.M. returned the invitation the next day. The Faith Tabernacle members accepted and promised to

attend the S.I.M. Special Service on the 21st instant but they failed. The only excuse they may have, no doubt, for this Faith Tabernacle Courtesy, will be the little rain which fell that night. The other denominations though were not invited as the Faith Tabernacles attended, many of them throughout the week, 18th to 22nd inst.
