First Luboil Plant In West Africa Opened

LAGOS—West Africa's first Lubricating Oil Blending Plant built by the Shell Company of Nigeria Limited at Apapa, Lagos, was officially opened by the Federal Minister of Mines and Power, Alhaji the Hon. Yusuf Maitama Sule, M. P., recently.

The plant cost £210,000, and is providing Nigeria with its first supplies of locally finished lubricating oils.

Before the plant began production, Shell imported all its finished lubricating oils. Now the Company imports only basic materials, and blends to produce the main grades of lubricating oils needed by Nigeria's fast growing industry and also for export to neighbouring countries.

The plant will produce up to £10,000 tons of lubricating oils a year from feedstocks discharged from ocean tankers at the Apapa jetty through a specially fabricated pipeline half a mile long, into eight main storage tanks.

A Nigerian, Mr. N.I. Udono who, in 1963, was sent to Mombasa in Kenya study the detailed operation of a similar plant built by Shell in that country, is in charge.

It was stated by the General Manager of the Company, Mr. A. D. MacPherson during the opening ceremony that the whole installation at Apapa represents an investment of £1,

250,000 itself. In addition, there are bulk depots at Port-Harcourt, Onitsha, Kaduna, Jos, and Kano, but taking into account our transport fleet aviation facilities, stocks etc., the overall fixed capital invested by The Shell Company of Nigeria is £5,250,000. All this is required to ensure that the customer gets his requirements at the right place, at the right time and in first class condition.

Nigeria's Educational Links With Britain

LONDON—Ways of increasing the flow of Nigerian postgraduate students to Britain are being discussed this week by the Agent General in Britain for Eastern Nigeria, Mr. Akpan Ekukinam Bassey, during a twelve-day tour of universities in Northern England and the Midlands.

Mr. Bassey, who started his tour on Sunday last, said at Leeds University,

on Wednesday, that although the number of Nigerian universities was increasing, Nigeria still wanted to preserve education links with Britain.

"As the flow of undergraduate students to Britain declines, we want to see the number of our postgraduates studying at British universities increasing", he said.

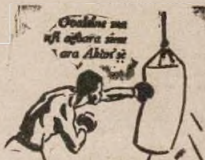

"HOW THE LAW WORKS"

Ignorance of the law is no excuse. Most people knew this, but they would be less likely to forget it, said Bill Everingham in a BBC African Service broadcast if they read a new book called "How the Law Works," by J. Ardie McArde.

"All that examples of the application of law in this book are applicable to life in Africa," he said. "It relates the adventures of Kwame, the man who usually gets away with breaking the law, and of Danadamu, who commit so many breaches of the law that he should be in prison for the rest of his life. From the book you will learn the basic principles of law." However, readers would have to check on any local differences in the established law. The author had been very careful to explain that the law was not to be found in any simple book or code. It had been built up over the centuries by custom and usage and it was therefore impossible to give a detailed account of the different legal systems in all African countries.

"There are chapters in this book," continued Everingham, on so many aspects of law that it would be almost impossible for anyone not to find himself affected by at least one of them". Among them was the law about defamation, with which he as personally concerned in his BBC broadcast. If written words cause people to have a bad opinion of someone then he can win an action for libel. As it happens I like this book, but I could defend what I say as fair comment because it is my opinion, which in this case I am allowed to broadcast freely.

Everingham ended his BBC broadcast by asking those listeners who thought they did not need any legal knowledge to test themselves with two of the problems he found in "How the Law Works."

"First, if your wife trades in the market under her own name, are you responsible for her debts? And second, do you need to put 'And Co. when you cross a cheque? The answer in each case was 'no'; a wife, if she worked on her own account, could not make her husband responsible for her business debts; and only the two lines were necessary when crossing a cheque. If you didn't get the correct answers, concluded Everingham, I suggest you buy the book. It may well save you a lot of money some day. At least you will earn a lot, I know I did."

Medical Scholarships For Doctors

LONDON — A British firm is again offering six medical fellowships for one year's post-graduate study in Britain in a selected branch of medicine. The fellowships are offered under a scheme begun in 1961 by Smith and Nephew, manufacturers of medical products, to enable doctors from overseas to complete their studies in Britain. They are available to doctors in Commonwealth and developing countries who are studying for high qualifications. The fellowships each worth £1,200,

are awarded alternately for surgery and medicine.

It is a condition of the award that doctors should return home within twelve months of completing their fellowship work. One Nigerian doctor has already completed a year in Britain on the fellowship. Dr. A. E. Ifeawungwa, who came to Britain from the General Hospital, Lagos, to study paediatrics. He returned home last June.

Last year one scholarship went to a Ghanaian surgeon.

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London Course For Nigerian Immigration Officers

LONDON — Four Nigerian immigration officers are attending a special month's course in London which includes lectures on the latest immigration methods and visits to busy ports and airports.

The course, organised by Britain's Department of Technical Co-operation, is being attended by fourteen immigration officers from Commonwealth countries. The Nigerians who have been granted fellowships to take the course under the Nigeria/Britain technical assistance arrangements, are Mallam L. Samba; from Zaria, and three immigration officers stationed in Lagos, Mr I-

N. Gana, Mr E. N. C. Okoye and Mr. A. O. Oredugba.

They arrived in London on January 17 and have attended lectures by immigration, procedure and general practice.

They have also studied immigration work on ships in the London Docks and at Dover and will also spend some time at London Airport.
