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TRUE PATRIOTISM.

XII.

TO mention the names of such men as our saintly Bishop James Johnson, Mr. J. A. Otunba-Payne, Prince Ademuyiwa Hastrup of Jebu-Remo (May they rest in peace) and others who have gone to their reward is to re-write the history of Lagos Colony and its Dependencies.

They were the pioneers of our present attainments along western civilisation. We are now reaping the fruits of the good seeds sown in tears by these faithful sons of Ethiopia. As a representative of the Community in the old Legislative Council of Lagos, the good Bishop—then the Rev. James Johnson sat in the Council for the preservation of our rights as British subjects and for good government. His last political act—even when out of the Council—is still fresh in the memory and the measure of contentment and happiness in Jebuland to-day are the direct outcome of his active intervention on behalf of the people at a time the authorities were almost misled into committing an error in the appointment of the rightful party as a ruler of Jebuland.

His efforts to raise the £10,000 required as an Endowment Fund of his African Bishopric Scheme and his incessant labours in the Niger regions until the last day of his death can never be forgotten. What Bishop Johnson strove to attain is now being fulfilled in the spirit by the constituency of the Diocese of Lagos,

who have now resolved to support their African prelate, his Lordship Bishop I. Oluwole—May his life be long spared to us.

The Niger has been reconstituted a separate Diocese in the (Episcopal Province to be) of Western Equatorial Africa, and two Bishops were placed in charge of the huge territory, where the late Bishop Johnson had laboured and died. It is confidently hoped the completion of the Endowment fund will not be longer delayed by all concerned and that the African Bishopric—the cherished aim of the late Bishop—will soon become an accomplished fact. This would be the best monument that every patriot should join hands in raising to the memory of the celebrated prelate.

Every historian, journalist, and almanac publishers are greatly indebted to Mr. J. A. Otunba-Payne, who besides his official duties as the Chief Registrar and Taxing Master of the Supreme Court, had found time to produce the famous Payne's Lagos Almanac for a number of years. It was not generally known among the people, the amount of losses incurred by Mr. Payne upon the printing of the Almanacs in those early years of the colony, when the reading public was very few indeed and the labour and expense involved in its production were not fully appreciated. But it had since become a work of reference for all event connected with the earlier history of the country. To-day, there are people who will not hesitate to pay 20/- for a copy of the Almanac.

His part in the institution and development of important British Lodges in Lagos are well known to the brethren

of the different fraternities.

The most fascinating side of Mr. Payne's life was his popularity with the school children during the Christmas and New Year's and other sports. His "Ready! One, Two, Three, Away!" are always eagerly awaited as also the Never-failing Gifts from his hands. He had by his exemplary conduct and faithful service to the Government scored a point in favour of all Africans in the civil service.

Prince Ademuyiwa Haastrup whose sojourn in England was immortalized in the pages of "Ally Sloper" cartoons of the "Nineties," was another self-sacrificing patriot, who spent his fortune in the interest of his country. If any one is deserving of praise for doing duty to his race, Prince Ademuyiwa is ten times more so. His visit to England as a West African prince did help in large measure to create more interest in the country and its inhabitants and the funny caricatures in the then famous Magazine ("Ally Sloper") only helped to intensify more curiosities among the British and Continental countries. Upon his return home, the prince gave himself more to evangelical exertions and was not known to have declined a call to preach from any of the Churches in Lagos, among which the First Baptist Church was greatly benefitted. Some of the special Hymns composed for such occasions have been incorporated in the Hymn books of most of the Christian Denominations—the most popular of which is—
