KING'S COLLEGE, LAGOS

ENTRANCE AND SCHOLARSHIP EXAMINATION, 1953

The Entrance and Scholarship Examination for admission to King's College in January, 1954, will be held on Saturday, 28th March, 1953.

2. Centres for the Examination will be as for last year, 1952.

3. The following papers will be set :—

(a) GENERAL PAPER ; (b) ARITHMETIC ; (c) ENGLISH.

4. Candidates should apply through their Headmasters to the Principal, in the case of those resident in Lagos, and to the nearest Education Officer (Provincial), in the case of those in the Provinces, not later than 14th February, 1953. No entries will be accepted after this date. Private candidates in Lagos should apply to the Principal, and in the Provinces to the nearest Education Officer. Applications will not be accepted from boys who will not be in Standard Five on the date of Examination.

5. There will be an entrance fee of 2s (two shillings) payable to the nearest Government Treasury, and the receipt for this must accompany every application. PAYMENT IN OTHER FORMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

6. A number of candidates will be required to present themselves at King's College, Lagos, for special interview before final selection. No candidate will be interviewed unless he can produce a birth certificate, or a declaration of age sworn by some responsible person. General physical development will be considered when no birth certificate is produced. No candidate will be admitted who will have attained fourteen years of age on 1st January, 1954.

7. Four Full Boarding and Tuition Scholarships and six Tuition Scholarships will be awarded to candidates on merit.

These are exclusive of books, school uniform and clothing. An admission deposit of £3 has to be paid for every boy before he is admitted to the College. This deposit will be refunded on production of the receipt when the boy leaves, less any deduction that has to be made for loss of, or unreasonable damage to school materials. All fees are payable termly in advance and no boy will be admitted until his fees have been paid. All admissions will be made at the beginning of Easter Term in January, 1954. A book deposit of £5 must also be paid to the Bursar.

9. Only Scholarship winners and candidates being offered admission will be informed. A list of successful candidates will be published in the Daily Papers and the *Nigeria Gazette*.

10. The Principal cannot enter into correspondence regarding the rejection of any candidate, nor will interviews be granted by himself or any member of the staff in connection with Examination Candidates.

11. Improper attempts to influence members of the College Staff regarding the admission of any candidate will result in the disqualification of the candidate on behalf of whom these advances are made.

1. The Entrance and Scholarship Examination for admission to Government College, Ibadan, in September, 1953, will be held on Saturday, 28th March, 1953.

2. There will be centres at Lagos, Abeokuta, Ijebu-Ode, Ilesha, Ibadan, Akure, Benin City, Warri, Asaba. Centres will be arranged in the Northern and Eastern Provinces as may be deemed necessary.
